

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Year of Blessing

Last week, I preached about the power of blessings, and invited us to try to offer each other words of encouragement and blessings. Our prayers and words of blessing have tremendous power, as do our words of criticism. One point that I made was that we often are quite good at criticizing others and ourselves. Let's try to be more intentional about using our words to bless others (and ourselves) this year. This excerpt from the Letter of St. James is powerful and more than a bit sobering:

"If anyone does not fall short in speech, he is a perfect man, able to bridle his whole body also. If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we also guide their whole bodies. It is the same with ships: even though they are so large and driven by fierce winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot's inclination wishes. In the same way the tongue is a small member and yet has great pretensions."

"Consider how small a fire can set a huge forest ablaze. The tongue is also a fire. It exists among our members as a world of malice, defiling the whole body and setting the entire course of our lives on fire, itself set on fire by Gehenna. For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. This need not be so, my brothers" (James 3:2b-10).

Prayers of Blessing

Based on what I preached about last weekend, I have printed out some prayers of blessing that you are free to use with your family and friends. You will find them at the various exits. There are two versions, one that focuses on the blessings we want to give (and receive), and a second one that also references lies the evil one can often try to get us to believe about ourselves. I would not use the second version unless there is evidence that (especially) children are tempted to believe those particular lies. (We don't want a blessing to plant ideas of lies in children's minds!) Use these as needed or desired, to bless those in your life. NOTE: If you have no one you think would be willing to bless you, please ask me. I am happy to pray prayers of blessing over you. God bless you all!

Holy Water of Blessing

Last week, many of you took home Holy Water, blessed chalk, and the blessing for your homes on the *Epiphany*. Holy Water is a powerful "sacramental," which aids us in the life of faith and holiness. Here is the majority of the blessing I used to bless the Holy Water. The first thing I did was exorcize and bless the salt. Then I exorcised the water with this prayer: Thou creature of water, I purge thee of evil in the name of God + the Father almighty, in the name of Jesus + Christ, His Son, our Lord, and in the power of the Holy + Spirit, that thou mayest be water fit to brace us against the envious foe. Mayest thou be empowered to drive him forth and exile him together with his fallen angels by the power of the selfsame Jesus Christ our Lord Who shall come to judge the living and the

dead, and the world by fire. Amen

After that, I blessed the exorcised water:

O God, Who for man's salvation dost dispense wondrous mysteries with the efficacious sign of water, hearken to our prayer—pouring forth thy benediction + upon this element which we consecrate with manifold purifications. Let this creature serve thee in expelling demons and curing diseases. Whatsoever it sprinkles in the homes of the faithful, be it cleansed and delivered from harm. Let such homes enjoy a spirit of goodness and an air of tranquility, freed from baneful and hidden snares By the sprinkling of this water may everything opposed to the safety and repose of them that dwell therein be banished, so that they may possess the well-being they seek in calling upon thy holy name, and be protected from all peril. Through our Lord. Amen.

Then, I added the blessed salt three times to the water while praying the following prayer:

May this salt and water be mixed together, in the name of the Father + and of the Son + and of the Holy + Spirit. Amen.

Then finally, I blessed the salt & water:

Author of invincible strength and king of an unconquerable empire, ever the gloriously Triumphant One! Who restrainest the force of the enemy, Who overcomest the fierceness of the devouring enemy, Who valiantly putteth down hostile influences! Prostrate and fearsome we beseech thee, Lord, consider kindly this creature of salt and water, make it honored, and sanctify it with the dew of thy sweetness. Wherever it is sprinkled in thy name, may devilish infection cease, venomous terror be driven afar. But let the presence of the Holy Spirit be ever with us as we implore thy mercy Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, thy Son, Who liveth and reighneth with thee in unity of the same Holy Spirit, God, eternally. Amen.

Holy Water

I am glad that so many of you took holy water bottles, and I invite you to refill them as often as needed from the holy water dispenser in the southeast corner of the church. You may want to get a holy water font at the entrance to your home or bedrooms. It would be a great thing to bless yourself (and children, if you have them) before you go to sleep. Holy Water reminds us of our baptism as well as the authority we have over the evil one. St. Teresa of Avila, reflecting on her own experience, says this: "From long experience I have learned that there is nothing like holy water to put devils to flight and prevent them from coming back again."
