A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Forty Days of Lent

This coming Wednesday, we begin again the Holy Season of Lent to prepare our hearts for the profundity of Holy Week. As we prepare for forty days of Lent, let us all fast, pray, and give alms for our own conversion, our parish, and our community. This is a moment of grace and opportunity, for us to be witnesses of the truth and the power of conversion. May we all pray and fast for others, that all men and women would yield their will to the will of the One who is truly Lord of Heaven and Earth. Please grab a copy of the *Magnificat Lenten Companion* on your way out this weekend.

Fasting for Him

As a reminder, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence. In the Church, the minimum required fast, which applies to those between the ages of 18 and 59, is to refrain from eating between meals and to limit their eating to one full meal and two lighter meals that do not add up to a full meal. The law of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) applies to those 14 years of age and older. *All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.* Let me encourage you to see these days of fasting and abstinence as an invitation to deepen your hunger for God and to discipline the appetites of the flesh.

Ash Wednesday and Beyond

There will be three Masses on Ash Wednesday at which we will distribute ashes. Come pray with us, as we begin our Lenten Journey together. The Masses will be held at 8:15 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 6:30 p.m. See the bulletin for other opportunities to pray more this Lent. Each Friday, we will pray the Stations of the Cross in the church at 6:30 p.m.

Flu Season Safeguards

After consulting with health care professionals, I have decided that because of the dangerous strain of the flu virus this year, I will not be encouraging people to make the sign of peace during Mass, which is liturgically "optional." Note that after the priest says, "The peace of the Lord be with you always," and the people reply, "And with your spirit," the Roman Missal gives the following rubric: "Then, if appropriate, the deacon, or the priest, adds: 'Let us offer each other the sign of peace.'" The Sign of Peace is not a mandatory, even if it is a customary, part of the liturgy. I will return to our custom of exchanging the sign of peace after the end of flu season. It would also be prudent to refrain from holding hands during the Our Father, if that is your posture during that prayer.

40 Days for Life (Planned Parenthood on Clippert)

Planned Parenthood of Frandor began performing chemical abortions over a year ago, which is why that is the location of 40 Days for Life this year. Beginning February 14th, please join us in prayer on the wide public berm on Clippert St, across the from PP in Frandor. Our efforts are prayer and fasting, not confrontation. Please consider coming out to pray. Be a witness for Christ. Be a witness for Life.

Courage Midwest Retreat

Next weekend, I will be in Indianapolis for a men's retreat sponsored by Courage. Courage, as you may recall, is a ministry to men and women who experience same-sex attractions and/or gender dysphoria. Courage

believes what the Church teaches us about human sexuality, and members strive to support each other through prayer, fellowship, chaste friendships, and all the helps of the sacramental life of the Church. Please pray for the retreatants, and the presenters, that we would all have powerful encounters with the love of Jesus. If you or someone you know experiences same-sex attractions and/or gender dysphoria, please encourage them to get in touch with me, so that I can let them know of the resources that are available locally and online. Thanks!

Freeing Up Our Hearts

As we enter this Holy Season of Lent, let me encourage you to consider making a good confession. If you sense a dryness in your heart or you can't "hear" the Lord speak to you, I invite you to pray through the steps of "Prayer of Forgiveness," which can be found on the bottom of Appendix 4 in the handout at the exits, to forgive those who might have sinned against you, and to consider how you might seek forgiveness too. Mercy and Forgiveness clear our hearts to receive (and give) love.

Beginning next Saturday (2/17), confessions prior to Saturday morning Masses (at 7:45 a.m.) will be canceled, because confessions will be heard after Saturday Masses, from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. Please note the change.

Seizing the Days

Let's not waste these forty days. The Church gives us these days of fasting, penance, and almsgiving to open our hearts and lives to the work of redemption. By the power of God's grace, let us work to master our passions, resist the lies and temptations of the Evil One and the world, and become more like Jesus, living (as He always did) in fellowship with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

PARISH-WIDE BABY SHOWER:

On February 24-25, the Altar Society will be sponsoring a "Baby Shower" to benefit two local, pro-life pregnancy support organizations. *New items, clean gently-used items, or cash donations* will be collected by representatives of the Altar Society after all Masses. (If you wish, you may write a check directly to either of the organizations – Shared Pregnancy or Pregnancy Services of Greater Lansing – your donation is tax deductible).

Items especially needed: baby wipes (~80 ct. containers are most useful), disposable diapers - newborn through size 6, nursing pads, receiving blankets, crib blankets, crib sheets, onesies or t-shirts, bibs, baby socks, sleepers, outfits – size newborn through size 3T, maternity clothes – especially large size, **cribs (to code: slat spacing no greater than 2-3/4 inch and must have all the hardware), and car seats – especially toddler car seats 2001 or newer (If a used car seat, all parts must be present. A car seat is not useable if it has been involved in a crash, even a minor crash.)**
