A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

May They Rest In Peace

As I am writing this bulletin article from the Smoky Mountains, I just got word that Fr. Bennett Constantine, former pastor of St. Peter's in Eaton Rapids has died. I will head back in order to be able to concelebrate the funeral Mass on February 24th. Fr. Ben was the pastor who welcomed my parents back into the Catholic Church in 1994, and supported them as they prayed that all of their sons would one day return to the Church, prayers that were answered in God's time. Fr. Ben celebrated his 60th Anniversary of his ordination in February, and I was able to celebrate with him and his former parishioners. Before I left for the Courage Retreat in Indianapolis, I was able to visit Fr. Ben at McLaren. He was lucid, but not able to speak because of the ventilator. I shared my gratitude with him, and asked for his blessing, which he gave me. He asked me to return the blessing, which I did happily. May he rest in peace.

Billy Graham Too

The great evangelist Billy Graham was called home in his 99th year. His tireless preaching of the gospel is legendary. There is no doubt that he preached to more people than anyone else who has ever lived. Though he was not Catholic, he loved Jesus and wanted others to know the love and mercy of God, to live lives of discipleship, and to "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." His "altar calls" were called "crusades" elicited decisions among countless people to have Jesus be Lord of their lives, and to commit to becoming disciples of Christ. May he rest in peace.

Receiving and Spreading the Good News

Billy Graham couldn't "shut up" about Jesus because he knew that Jesus was the answer to the question of every human life. St. Paul couldn't "shut up" about Jesus either. Neither could countless missionaries and saints, Catholic and otherwise. Jesus gave us the "Great Commission" in Matthew 28:16-20:

The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

To the extent that we have received the Good News into our hearts and lives, we will be eager to help others experience the Good News ourselves. It's an active work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. We Catholics are often reluctant to share the Good News, because we don't know the scriptures as well as we'd like, but the truth is that people respect us and are open to hearing our witness of what difference faith has made in our lives.

Come and See

For several months now, every other week, a new opportunity has been available to grow in our faith. You, your friends, and family are invited to "Come and See," a new bi-weekly opportunity that is held in the St. John Paul II room (the old St. Vin-

cent de Paul space at 123 Rumsey). These evenings, every other Wednesday at 7pm, include fellowship, some singing, a talk or testimony, conversation about the Lord, and conclude with a time of prayer. Join us on February 28th. I'm excited about this initiative, because it offers us another way to enhance our sense of community and to help "ease" people back into the Church if they have been away. It would be helpful for those who are interested in inviting others to come to the "Come and See" to visit and see what happens. That way, when you invite someone else, you can give them a good sense of what happens, and you will make them more comfortable if you join them. We want to be a parish of intentional disciples, who live the faith and share the faith with others, who can, in turn, become disciples, and share the faith with still more people. Let's pray for each other, that we might develop a heart for others, and to learn to share our faith in honest, humble ways.
