A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Healing the Whole Person Retreat Testimony

Sean and Liz O'Neill attended the HWP Retreat in April, and I asked them to draft a testimony about their experience. This is what Sean wrote:

In April of this year, my wife, Liz, and I attended a "Healing the Whole Person" retreat in Ennis, Texas, given by Bob Schuchts and his team. Both of us received significant inner healing at this event and found that the talks delivered by Bob clarified and explained much of what he had written in his book, "Be Healed." I would go so far as to say that for me, the retreat was life-changing, as the message of healing and the prayer ministry during the sessions focused on wounds from my past that had been an obstacle to me.

A number of those present told of the Lord's healing touch in their lives. We were particularly moved by a testimony given by a young woman who had suffered from debilitating depression for most of her life and who experienced the Lord's healing through prayer ministry, so that now the depression has evaporated and she can live a normal life. Many people also witnessed to physical healings that took place during the prayer sessions.

Bob Schuchts's view is that by healing the whole person, psychologically, physically, spiritually and emotionally, we become free to respond to God's love in our lives and become holier – in other words, wholeness = holiness. This has been borne out by my own experience. After I received inner healing at that retreat, there was a wonderful breakthrough in my relationship with Jesus in a way that I had never known before and I felt the love of God in my life in a new way. Liz and I have found that the healing we received is continuing to bear fruit in our lives, long after the retreat finished.

We are all broken in one way or another, so I would encourage anyone who is struggling with wounds, difficulties or sins from the past (or present) to sign up for the retreat in September at the Church of the Resurrection. The cost of the retreat is \$150 per person, a small price to pay for a chance to deepen your relationship with the Lord in a new and powerful way and experience real and tangible life-changing healing.

I believe it is worth every bit of the \$150 it costs. Note that the fee is set by the JP II Healing Center, and helps cover the cost of their team's travel and ongoing ministry. Back-to-School Night:

We are under two weeks away from the start of school, and I want to remind parents about our Back-to-School night on Monday, August 21st. We will begin at 6:30 PM in the parish hall. This will be an event just for parents, so please make arrangements for childcare as needed. All the teachers will be there, and there will be similar rotations for parents to meet with the homeroom teachers.

Length of the School Day:

The daily schedule for the school is adjusting this year. The new start and end times will be from 8:00 AM - 3:00 PM. This decision was reach through discussion with Fr. Steve, the school commission and was finalized by the parish leadership team. This change will not decrease the number of instructional blocks we offer in the middle school or elementary, but it will shorten each of them by 2 minutes.

However, we will make up the time lost as we increase to 180 days of instruction. Last fall, the school was granted a waiver from the state mandate of a 180 day calendar for the 16-17 school year. These requirements are mandated on private schools through the Michigan Association of Non-Public Schools. The waiver granted to us was based on our being 152 instructional hours (20 full days) over the minimum state requirement of 1,098 hours. Therefore, we decided to shift the start and end times for the school day in order to meet 180 day requirement without over taxing our students and families.

We prayerfully reached this decision as we want to be mindful of family time, and we believe this decision will help us align even more to our core value of supporting families

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd The Mystery of the Child Meets the Mystery of God

As we prepare for another school year, the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd team would like to share some information about this wonderful experience offered to our school and parish children. Yes, you read correctly, new this year, 2017-2018, we are offering CGS, Level 1, to our parish children.

CGS was developed over sixty years ago by Sofia Cavalletti, a Hebrew and biblical scholar from Rome. Together with Dr. Gianna Gobbi, who trained with Maria Montessori, and Dr. Silvana Montanaro, a child development specialist, Cavaletti developed a program for 3-12 year olds on church doctrine, the Bible and the Holy Mass with a hands-on approach using the Montessori method. Children are grouped based on age, with three different levels-Level I for 3-6 year olds, Level II for 6-9 year olds, and Level III for 9-12 year olds.

Why start a program for the Level I child?

At this age, children are developmentally ready and anxious to form a deeper relationship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who calls them by name. Children of this age are deeply connected to God; they can easily fall in love with Jesus and begin a life-long relationship with our Good Shepherd. Waiting until the child is 6 or 7 would mean passing the sensitive period for the personal relationship with Jesus and jumping into the moral reasoning stage first. Without a foundation of love, the law becomes an obligation instead of a gift and a response.


