- 3) We are <u>supportive of families</u>. This means we commit to partnering with parents and supporting them in their role as the primary educators of their children in the ways of faith; we seek ways to strengthen marriages; and we provide other practical supports for families.

For ninety-five years, we have served the city. Today, we continue to seek God's leading and strive to live out these values. To that end, we have drafted a revised "<u>Mission</u> Statement," which is as follows:

Located in the heart of the City of Lansing, the Church of the Resurrection exists to help everyone in our parish family live in the light and hope of the Resurrection. Encouraged by our experience of God's love, we help others come to know and love Jesus in a personal way. Guided by God's truth, we offer answers to life's real challenges. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we help each other become mature disciples of Christ who will utilize the gifts God has given us to spread the Good News of Jesus in word and deed.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd The Mystery of the Child Meets the Mystery of God

"Help me to come closer to God by myself."

So what is discussed in each Level?

Level 1 is designed for children ages 3 through 6 years old. Here they discover the Good Shepherd who loves us completely and calls us by name. They also learn about Jesus, who was a real person who lived in the land of Israel and is the Light of the World. They become very familiar with the mystery of the Kingdom of God as told by Jesus in parables and learn the symbols, gestures, and language of the Sacraments of Eucharist and Baptism. Resurrection offers Level 1 to both school and parish children who are 4 and 5 years old by September 1.

In Level II, by trusting that God loves them, children in grades 1through 3 come to know that God is working out a plan of salvation from Creation, through Redemption, to the Parousia and that God call each of us to participate in this plan. Here they discover that Jesus shows us the way to live together in peace and joy, and that He is calling us to abide in Him through Eucharist and Baptism. This level also includes 2 years of immediate sacrament preparation, although the child has been preparing since birth for reception of the sacrament.

CGS, Level 1 is being offered for 2017-2018 school year for our parish children.


