Get Ready!

Once we're through the Labor Day weekend next weekend, we will have a September filled with opportunities here at the Church of the Resurrection. First up, of course, will be the 83rd annual Ox Roast Festival, which will be held September 8-10. If you are able to donate some hours to serve in a variety of capacities, please contact the "co-chairs." Please also invite your friends, neighbors, and family members to join you at the Festival. It's always a great time for fellowship and fun. Thanks to all those who have served so faithfully for so long to make this such a valuable annual event.

Next Up Is *Alpha* (Beginning September 13)

If you and/or your friends and family have questions about Jesus or about what Christians believe or why Catholics do this or that, consider attending the *Alpha Course* this fall. It's a low-pressure opportunity to enjoy a good meal, watch an engaging video, and have a good (did I say "low pressure"?) conversation. No questions are off limits. Please prayerfully consider this for yourself or to invite others. Beginning on Wednesday September 13, we will offer the *Alpha Course*. If you or someone you know has questions about Jesus and/or the Christian faith, please join us for the *Alpha Course*. We get started at 6:30 each Wednesday. Childcare is available. Healing the Whole Person Retreat (September 14-16)

The *Healing the Whole Person* Retreat is drawing near. (September 14th, 15th, and 16th—Thursday & Friday evenings, and all day Saturday). I believe it is worth every bit of the \$150 it costs. Note that the fee is set by the JP II Healing Center, and helps cover the cost of their team's travel and ongoing ministry. Do You Believe In Miracles? (September 18)

After that, we'll have a dramatic presentation on the science of the Eucharist. Tim Francis tells the story of his own dramatic conversion and includes a multi-media show with exclusive -film footage examining: 1) A stigmatist who suffers similar wounds to the wounds of Christ; 2) A consecrated Communion Host becomes Living flesh and blood; 3) A famous TV Journalist who witnesses a statue of Jesus weeping real tears and shedding real blood. *Are these claims true?* Tim explains what science has to say. The event is free.

Peter Herbeck recommended Tim Francis on 4-16-17 when he interviewed him on *The Choices We Face* on EWTN,

saying: *We're here with Tim Francis... We're talking about amazing stories and amazing truth of the Catholic Church.... Why don't you tell our listeners how they can get a hold of you and bring you to their parish, because this is stuff I think everybody needs to hear.... Fantastic, Tim, it's great that you were able to be with us. I'm so proud of you, so inspired by you. It's really great. You do really great work. It's a big help.... These kinds of miracles, the Lord is speaking through them to us.... (The Choices We Face, April 16, 2017).*

This audio-visual presentation will be in the Diocese of Lansing, at **Resurrection Parish on September 18th from 7 pm – 9:30 pm in Mercy Hall (127 Rumsey)**. It will be at other area parishes after that: (St. Mary's Williamston September 19 from 6:30 p.m. to 9:00, IHM September 20 from 6:30 to 9:00 p.m., and St. Patrick's in Brighton, September 21 from 6:30 to 9:00 p.m.)

Interested in learning more about the Catholic Church (RCIA)?

Each fall, as we begin a new season of learning, we also begin programming for those who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith. This year, Rich Budd will be teaching classes for adults as well as high school students who are interested in learning more and potentially becoming Catholics at the Easter Vigil in the spring. Rich's full time job is Director of Family Life for the Diocese of Lansing. He helped out with the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) classes last year, and I'm grateful that he will be serving the parish in this way. Details about the RCIA class times will be finalized soon. Once again this year, Angie Amburn will be working with those students up to 8th grade who are interested in learning more about and/or becoming Catholic at the Easter Vigil in the spring. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd
The Mystery of the Child Meets the Mystery of God

“Help me to come closer to God by myself.”

So what is discussed in each Level?

Level 1 is designed for children ages 3 through 6 years old. Here they discover the Good Shepherd who loves us completely and calls us by name. They also learn about Jesus, who was a real person who lived in the land of Israel and is the Light of the World. They become very familiar with the mystery of the Kingdom of God as told by Jesus in parables and learn the symbols, gestures, and language of the Sacraments of Eucharist and Baptism. Resurrection offers Level 1 to both school and parish children who are 4 and 5 years old by September 1.

In Level II, by trusting that God loves them, children in grades 1 through 3 come to know that God is working out a plan of salvation from Creation, through Redemption, to the Parousia and that God call each of us to participate in this plan. Here they discover that Jesus shows us the way to live together in peace and joy, and that He is calling us to abide in Him through Eucharist and Baptism. This level also includes 2 years of immediate sacrament preparation, although the child has been preparing since birth for reception of the sacrament.

CGS, Level 1 is being offered for 2017-2018 school year for our parish children. Class will meet Wednesday’s 9:15-10:30, the cost is \$100 for 1st child and \$50 each additional..
