Each fall, as we begin a new season of learning, we also begin programming for those who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith. This year, Rich Budd will be teaching classes for adults as well as high school students who are interested in learning more and potentially becoming Catholics at the Easter Vigil in the spring. 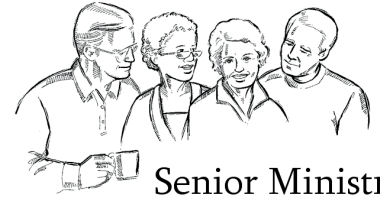
