We had over 300 attend, and many graces were received by those who participated in the weekend retreat, including me. I talked about the retreat in my homily last weekend, and I encourage anyone who is curious or was not at Mass last week, to listen to it. I sense the Lord's continued leading in my life to focus on helping us all (beginning with myself) come to know the love of the Father more and more. I am very grateful for the tremendous work that the planning team of Liz O'Neill, Sean O'Neill, Stacie DeVries, and Ben Pohl did to prepare for the event, which, with the help of hosts of volunteers and intercessors, was so wonderfully successful. Thanks to the students form Lansing Catholic for their help as well. God was present in a powerful way, and I can't wait to see what the Lord has in store for all of us. One final note: Sadly, this past Monday, we learned that Bob Schuchts' wife, Margie, died of the brain disease she had developed. We had been praying for her miraculous healing, but that was not God's will. Bob told us that he and his family were offering their suffering for all those who were part of the retreat. What a great gift that was to us, and what redemptive fruit it bore! May Margie and all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.
