A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Greetings from the Sea of Galilee

I'm writing this bulletin article from a hotel overlooking the Sea of Galilee, the morning after our first day of the pilgrimage. I can already tell that being in the Holy Land is truly like reading the "Fifth Gospel," which is how Blessed Pope Paul VI talked about his own experience here in 1964. We began the day with Mass at the Church of the Transfiguration on the top of Mount Tabor. The sun came in brightly the east stainedglass windows, as we recounted the Gospel. Here, "on this mountain" Jesus was transfigured, Moses & Elijah appeared, and the Father spoke those beautiful words, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased. Listen to Him." We are all here to listen to Him, and to bring back to Michigan the fruits of this encounter with God's life and love, and it's been a great beginning. After that, we visited Cana, where the married couples renewed their marriage vows. We ended the first day in Nazareth, visiting the Basilica of the Annunciation of the Lord. It includes the very place where the Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary to announce that she was the chosen one to bear God's son. We also visited the cave dwellings where the Holy Family dwelled (Nazareth was a very small community—perhaps only 250 people—at the time, and all of the residents lived in elaborate cave dwellings. It was remarkable to imagine little Jesus running in and out of the rock-hewn home, growing up in wisdom and knowledge.

This morning we will go to the place where Jesus gave the Sermon on the Mount, and recall the beginning of His teaching ministry, as well as visit the place where He multiplied the loaves and the fish and the beautiful sea-side resurrection scene from John 21, where Jesus offers the apostles a fish breakfast after the miraculous haul of 153 fish. All of us here feel blessed to be able to be here, and we hold all of you in our prayer. Please continue to pray for us, that our experience here will bear fruit in and through us.

Annual Convocation of Priests of the Diocese of Lansing

Please pray for the priests as they gather for four days with Bishop Boyea for a time of fellowship, prayer, and learning together at our annual convocation. It will be held Monday afternoon, October 2 – Thursday, October 5. I will return from the Holly Land on Tuesday, October 3, and will head straight to the convocation that evening. As a result, there will be no Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday. Please note that **we will have Tuesday evening devotions, but no Mass, Holy Hour, or confessions**. Monday and Friday will be as usual. Please keep Bishop Boyea and all our priests in your prayers this week. Thank you!

Next weekend, Sr. Mary Kay Druoin, O.P. will be here to share about her ministry at Resurrection Home in Kentucky. Three Years Ago Today

Grand River by God's grace, and of course with the prayerfulness of many men and women in our community. It was also, of course, thanks to Cecilia Tombelli, who until recently served as the Coordinator of the New Life Center and Director of Project Rachel for the Diocese of Lansing. Since early 2015, we have been offering hope and healing to men and women who have contemplated and/or have been affected by abortions, and I am confident that the Lord will continue to use the New Life Center to promote Life, and to help continue the hope and healing the Lord offers everyone.

Today (Sunday, October 1) is Pro-Life Sunday, and we are invited to participate in a peaceful prayer chain witnessing to the sanctity of life.
