A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

It's Good to Be Back

The pilgrimage to the Holy Land is over. It was one of the greatest experiences of my life, a tremendous privilege and grace. We finished up the pilgrimage in Jerusalem, where Jesus suffered and died for us. We also took a trip out of Jerusalem to see where Jesus was baptized, and to take a swim (or should I rather say "float"?) in the Dead Sea, the lowest place on earth. Among the most memorable moments of the pilgrimage for me was praying Mass in the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus experienced the spiritual suffering of anticipating the sacrifice that He would make for you and me. The greatest highlight for me, though, by far was celebrating Mass in the very place where Jesus was laid in the tomb. To be there, in that holy place, celebrating the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, was among the greatest privileges of my priesthood. After the consecration, I brought Jesus out of the tomb to say "Behold the Lamb of God . . ." It was an amazing experience for me, as a priest, to be there and to celebrate Mass where Jesus was buried. As we know, the tomb is empty, which is the reason that we have faith, hope, and love today. Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! There in that place, and reflecting on the entire pilgrimage, it was clear that the other pilgrims and I were invited to live more deeply the "resurrection life." That's my prayer for each of you, as well. When I prayed Mass each day, I included the intentions you shared with me and the other intentions in your heart. I was privileged to be able to pray for you each day at Mass. Thank you for your prayers for me and the other pilgrims. It was a grace for us.

Annual Convocation of Priests of the Diocese of Lansing

I'm writing this from the priestly convocation, which is in Frankenmuth this year. Thank you for your prayers for Bishop Boyea and all the priests of the diocese. It was a good time of fellowship and reflection on the Social Teachings of the Catholic Church.

School Administrators' Conference

Please pray for Jacob Allstott and other Catholic school principals from around the state. As a member of the Board of the Michigan Association of Non-Public Schools (M-A-N-S), I will be joining with administrators from around the country for a conference. I will offer Mass for the Catholics who will attend the conference. M-A-N-S is a 40+ year old organization comprised of Catholics, Missouri Synod Lutherans, and other Christians, who work together to support faith-based schools. I'm grateful for the leadership of Jacob Allstott and the many other dedicated faith-based educators. Please keep us in prayer at the end of this week. Thank you. (Because of this conflict, the Men's Evening of Adoration will be moved to Friday, 13th evening this month, from 7-8 p.m.)

Support for Resurrection Home

This weekend, Sr. Mary Kay Drouin, O.P. will be here to share about her ministry at Resurrection Home in Kentucky. As we have for many, many years, there will be a chance to generously support her ministry there. We will have a second collection, and you will be able to give support in future weeks by placing "Resurrection Home" on the memo line. Checks should be written to the "Church of the Resurrection" with a memo "Resurrection Home." Please give generously, if you are able. Now that I am back, I will soon be meeting with Deb Amato, the bishop's Chief of Staff, and Deacon Jim Kasprzak, who supervises Catholic Charities for the Diocese of Lansing, to discuss diocesan hopes and expectations for the position that we will soon post for the new Coordinator of the New Life Center and Director of Project Rachel for the Diocese of Lansing. We want to continue the good work that has been done here, and to potentially expand the role of this individual to meet unmet needs the diocese has in terms of promoting the culture of life, and the provision of hope and healing for those who have been harmed by abortion. Please pray for us as we finalize the job description, post the position, and conduct the search. Thank you.

The Beauty of Michigan

One side-benefit of the pilgrimage was a renewed appreciation for "Pure Michigan." Though the hills of Judea outside of Jerusalem had what seemed a rather European mountain beauty to them, much of the nation of Israel, especially to the south of Jerusalem to the Jordan and the Dead Sea, was stark, dry, and brown. There was relatively little green vegetation, and it made me grateful for the tremendous resource and beauty of the Great Lakes. It's a great place to visit, in other words, but I'm glad I live here!

Lumen Veritatis Returns on October 21st!






