Healing Encounter

Every Second Saturday of even months (February, April, etc.), we are holding "Healing Encounters" in the church beginning at 7:00 p.m. We began this tradition after the experience with the "Burning Bush" at the Parish Ignition this past February. It will be this Saturday evening (September 14), beginning at 7:00 p.m. If you have your candle from the Parish Ignition or an earlier Healing Encounter, please bring that with you. We have a procession during the evening, where individuals (or families) bring up their candles to place them on the four level "burning bush" that is the platform for the monstrance. We then take time in praise and adoration, a brief testimony, as well as silent prayers and then prayers for healing of hearts, minds, souls, and bodies. It's a wonderful way to spend a Saturday evening. We will have prayer teams available to pray with you, as well as the general opportunity to take time worshiping the Lord in the context of Eucharistic Adoration. Hope to see you there!

Lumen Veritatis

Our second season of *Lumen Veritatis* will get under way this coming Saturday evening, October 21st at Lansing Catholic High School at 7:00 p.m. in the LCHS auditorium. This series is intended to help adults have an evening of fellowship and growth as we together engage with what is Beautiful, Good, and True. Next Saturday, Sister Louis Marie, superior of the Dominican Sisters' community here in Lansing, will be giving a talk entitled "Aquinas on Humility: Evidencing Man's Relation to God." She holds Sacred Theology Licentiate in philosophy from the Catholic University of America (CUA). During her time at CUA, Sister focused on study of Aristotelian virtues and Thomistic metaphysics. She will be presenting portions of her thesis on St. Thomas Aquinas' exposition of the virtue of humility in the Summa Theologica, Secunda Secundae. The format of the evening is light appetizers, drinks, and fellowship at 7:00 p.m. Sister's talk will follow at 7:30 or so, and will conclude with time for questions. Those who attend are invited to stay after to enjoy good conversation, food and drink. If you haven't joined us before, consider making it an evening. I think you'll enjoy yourself. It is one of the ways we are trying to foster Christian culture in our community.


Christ Has No Body


