A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Annual Report

Please find enclosed in this bulletin our 2016-2017 Annual Report. My plan is to answer questions that parishioners have about this next Sunday, October 29th after the 11:00 a.m. Mass in the cafeteria end of Mercy Hall. As noted in the Annual Report, we have officially surpassed our Witness to Hope combined goal of \$2,100,000. Our pledges now total \$2,136,789. Thank you all!

Sanctuary Beautification

You may recall that when we presented the case for the Witness to Hope campaign, we showed a few different schemes produced by Granda Liturgical Design which is based in Spain. They provided those renderings for free. Based on suggestions from Denis McNamara, who spoke on Church Architecture last year at *Lumen Veritatis*, I invited an architect he recommended to make a visit to learn how he would recommend we beautify the sanctuary to help us better experience the Heavenly Liturgy. He made a visit in mid-September. He and his team, which is based in Evanston, IL, are working on some renderings for us to consider in the next month or so. As this process continues, we will arrange times for parishioners to provide feedback on the renderings that we have and will (hopefully soon) receive. Please pray for wisdom as we proceed, that the changes we contemplate will help us more effectively worship God and enter into the Heavenly Liturgy at Mass.

Lumen Veritatis

As I announced last week, the second season of *Lumen Veritatis* gets under way this Saturday evening, October 21st at Lansing Catholic High School at 7:00 p.m. in the LCHS auditorium. Sister Louis Marie, O.P. will be giving a talk entitled “*Aquinas on Humility: Evidencing Man’s Relation to God.*” A month from now, on SUNDAY, November 19th, my brother, Dan Mattson, who, author of *Why I Don’t Call Myself Gay: How I Reclaimed My Sexual Reality and Found Peace*, will share the journey of his life as the Prodigal Son who left God behind to live the way the world said he could find happiness. That didn’t work, and, much to his surprise, he finally found the peace and happiness he was looking for in the last place he expected to find it, the Catholic Church.

Preaching & Living the Truth

This past week, Rod Dreher, author of *The Benedict Option: A Strategy for Christians in a Post-Christian Nation*, had a blog post entitled “Preaching Honestly in a Post-Christian World” on *The American Conservative* website, asking pastors, priests, and other ministers to talk about how their respective parishes and denominations are dealing with the cultural challenges of our time. I was pleased to be able to add my voice to the conversation. Indeed, it was a joy to talk about how responsive you are to the messages that I sense the Lord is inviting me to preach to myself and to you. Thank you for your open-hearted, prayerful engagement with the Word preached. I’m privileged to be your pastor, and to see God at work in your lives. Please keep me in prayer, that I will remain attentive to God’s promptings, faithful in my preaching, and wise in the actions that I take in consultation with the parish leadership.

Moralistic Therapeutic Deism (MTD)

One reason I read Rod Dreher regularly is the prophetic way he highlights the cultural currents and dangerous developments that are affecting many Christian traditions. Dreher has recently reminded me of the important work of Christian Smith, et al., whose sociology of religion research has focused on youth and their experience of faith. His many books include *Soul Searching: the Religious and Spiritual Lives of American Teenagers* (2005), *Souls in Transition: The Religious and Spiritual Lives of Emerging Adults* (2009), *Lost in Transition: The Dark Side of Emerging Adulthood* (2011), and *Young Catholic America: Emerging Adults In, Out of, and Gone from the Church* (2014). These are, frankly speaking, sobering books to read. In *Soul Searching*, Christian Smith and his co-authors describe the basic beliefs of most youth today, which they call *Moralistic Therapeutic Deism*. MTD might be described as the general sense that God wants us to be nice, to be happy, and to get to heaven, but He’s not much involved in daily life, and the particulars of one’s belief don’t matter much at all. In his later works, Christian Smith makes clear how much parents’ engagement with the faith influences whether youth will know and practice their faith when they get older. The statistics are sobering, but the lessons your children learn from you, their parents, are incomparable. In other words, parents: you matter. A LOT. Thank you for your witness.

Our Goals at the Parish and School

It is precisely to help you and your families get to heaven that we are committed to offering opportunities like the Healing the Whole Person Retreat, *Lumen Veritatis*, increased emphasis on faith in our school, etc. Please pray as we continue to seek for ways to engage all parishioners in finding the best ways for them to use their gifts for the building up of the kingdom of God and the salvation of souls. If adults are living their faith in a vibrant way, children will “catch” it naturally. Our faith is not a set of ideas, but an encounter with the living God, life-giving and joyful. May it be so for the children in our midst!

With hopes and prayers that children in our parish & school will know and love Jesus even more than their parents,

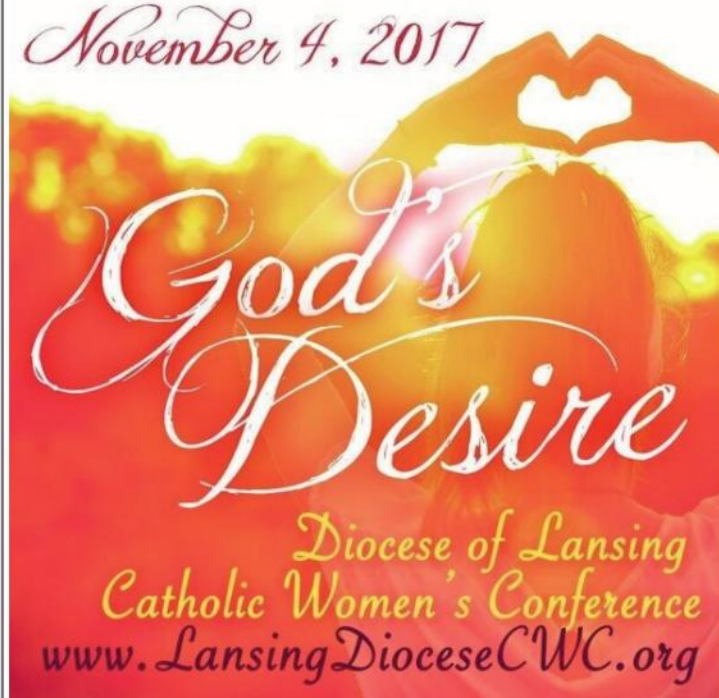

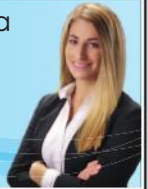

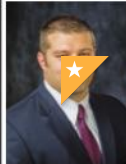
