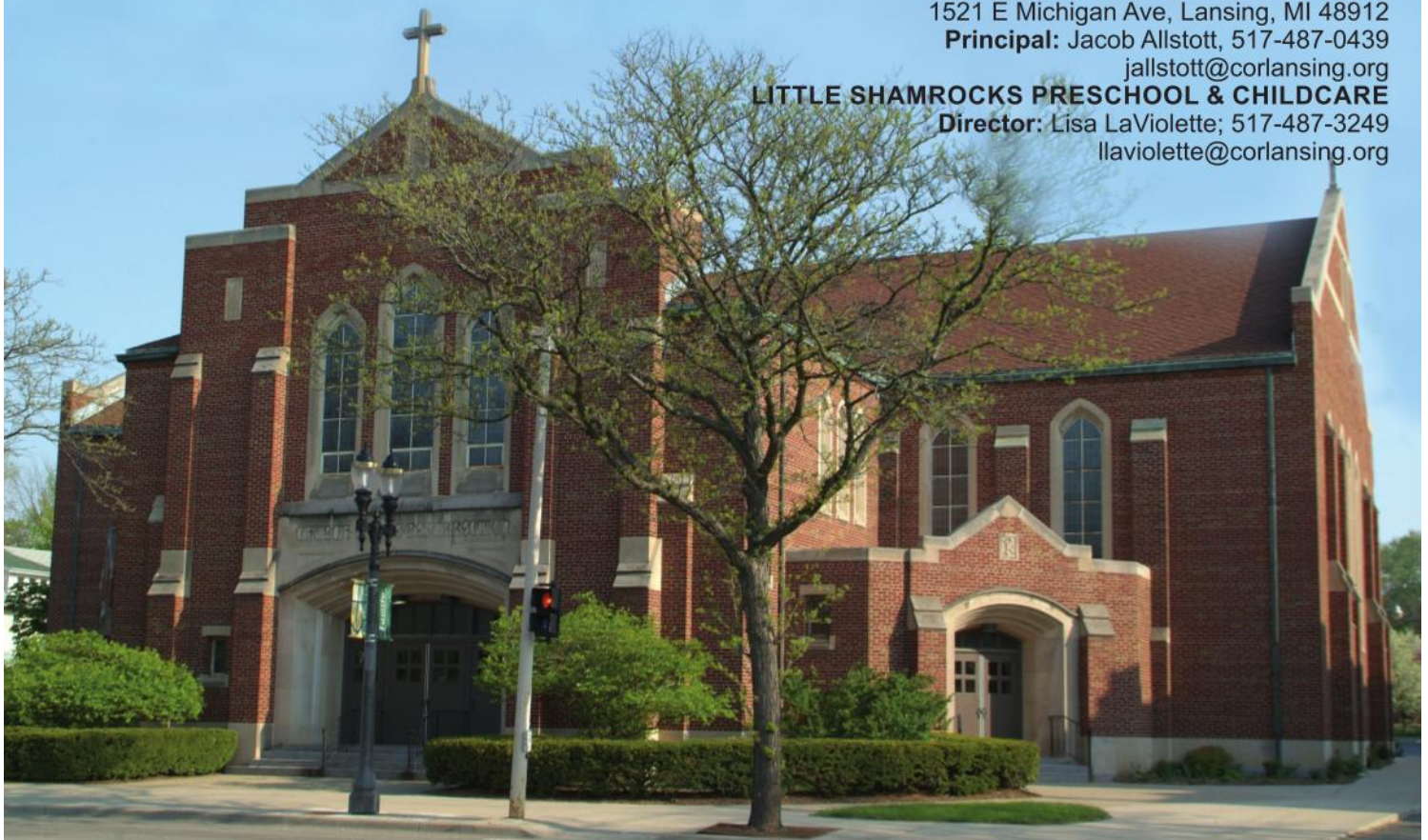

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Annual Report Discussion

My plan is to answer questions that parishioners have regarding the 2016-2017 Annual Report this Sunday, October 29th at 1:00 p.m. in the cafeteria end of Mercy Hall. If you did not pick a copy up with your bulletin last week, additional copies are available at the back of the church.

Witness to Hope

As noted in the Annual Report last week, we have officially surpassed our Witness to Hope combined goal of \$2,100,000. Our pledges now total \$2,136,789. As you may recall, the likely total of the two projects we are hoping to complete, the connection between the school buildings and the renovation of the sanctuary would total about \$375,000 more than we have pledged at this point. We are hopeful that future gifts and/or bequests to the parish will help us bridge the gap between the money pledged and the total cost of the projects. Because parishioners have been very generous in the past, both with bequests and other significant donations, I remain hopeful that we will be able to complete both of these projects. Thank you all again for your generosity!

“Reformation Sunday”

Last week at a couple of the Masses, I wrongly stated that last Sunday was “Reformation Sunday.” That’s actually this Sunday. It’s been 500 years since Martin Luther challenged the Church (which was admittedly not perfect in Her disciplines), and eventually split from the Church and denounced Catholic practices. I was thinking about that, when last Sunday, I had the opportunity to have dinner and talk with Fr. Mike Murray, who is an alumnus of Msgr. John Gabriels High School. As he was recalling his time in high school, he mentioned the Christian Brothers and Adrian Dominicans that he had as teachers. I was fascinated when he told me that the Adrian Dominican Sisters made things very clear whenever they talked about what happened in the Church in 1517. It was never to be called the “Protestant Reformation,” they said, but always only the “Protestant Revolt.” Today, we live in more “ecumenically sensitive times.” Nevertheless, the sisters clear statements should give us pause. Some today claim that there really is no difference between the Catholic and Lutheran understandings of, for example, justification. But that’s simply not true. If you doubt that, just ask the Lutherans who are most committed to their beliefs. Ask the Catholics who are most convinced of theirs. You’ll get the same answer from both, “we don’t agree about justification.” Sad, but true.

We Don’t Celebrate Luther

Though Martin Luther meant well, he harmed the Church. Furthermore, as much good as he sought to accomplish (and the good that he actually did accomplish), he was no saint. Attempts to make him a hero of the Catholic faith are simply misguided. Note well: we Catholics don’t reject our Lutheran brothers & sisters, and we can often work with them to accomplish the common good. However, we don’t make things better by pretending that we are of the same mind

and beliefs. Let us pray, as we recall the 500th anniversary of Luther’s actions, the prayer the Lord prayed in John 17: [“And now I will no longer be in the world, but they are in the world, while I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are.”](#) Let’s keep praying!

All Hallows Eve & the Solemnity of All Saints

All Saints Day is Wednesday, November 1, when we celebrate all the saints who have gained access to the everlasting beatitude of heaven. All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation, which means that all Catholics are expected to attend Mass to celebrate the Saints who have gone before us. We will have three All Saint’s Masses, one at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, and a (school) Mass at 8:15 a.m. and another Mass at 12:00 noon on Wednesday. We will not have the normal Holy Hour after the Tuesday evening Mass, but I will hear confessions as usual after that Mass.

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls)

November 2 is All Souls Day, when we pray for all our beloved dead, that they will be purified of any attachments to the things of earth. We commend them to the merciful fire of God’s redeeming love to perfect those we love. Our loved ones benefit from our prayers and sacrifices on their behalf. We fail in our charity if we neglect to pray for those who have died. Purgatory, far from a “second chance” is a place of loving purification. All those who are in Purgatory will one day be in Heaven, so it is the next best place to Heaven. But we can’t presume that those who have gone before us are already in Heaven. Let us therefore never cease to pray for them.

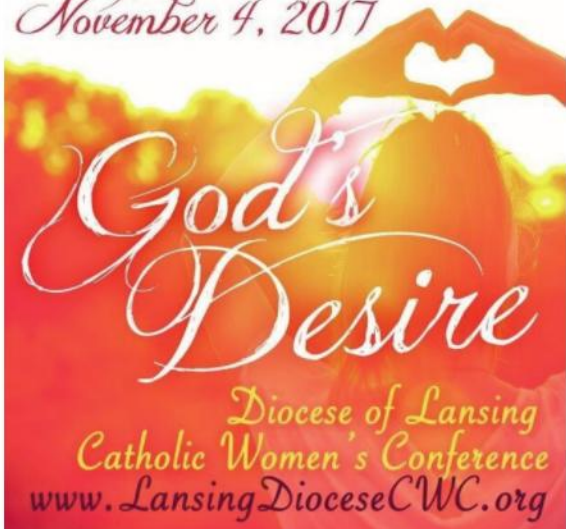

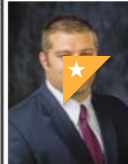
