The peaceful prayer event will be held from 2:30-3:30 this afternoon, asking God to bless our efforts to promote the sanctity of all human life.

#### The Message of Fatima

Last weekend, I preached about the impact of visiting Fatima had on me, and the ways that it has stirred in my heart a great desire to become holy, and to embrace and enact the message of Fatima, which is all about lovingly offering prayers, adoration, sacrifices, and reparations for the conversion of sinners. Here are some of the accounts that I shared last week:

[I]n the spring of 1916. Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta were together that day tending their families' flocks of sheep at the Cabeco, one of their favorite grazing spots. It had been raining earlier in the morning, but eventually the sky cleared. They ate their lunch and then prayed the Rosary together. Eager to play, the children often prayed as quickly as possible with their own shortened version of the Rosary, saying on each bead only the first two words of the Hail Mary or Our Father.

After their prayers that day, as they were starting to play a game, a strong wind shook the tree tops. Lucia described in her memoirs what they saw: "a young man, about fourteen or fifteen years old, whiter than snow, transparent as crystal when the sun shines through it and of great beauty".

The children were astonished but said nothing to each other.
Then the angel spoke: "Do not be afraid. I am the Angel of Peace. Pray with me." . . . . The angel invited the children to pray with him and taught them a prayer they had never known before. First he knelt down and bowed until his forehead touched the ground.

The angel then taught the children a beautiful prayer which is usually referred to as the Pardon Prayer: My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love You! I ask pardon of You for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love You. The angel repeated these words three times. Then he rose and said to the children, "Pray thus. The Hearts of Jesus and Mary are attentive to the voice of your supplications." Then the angel disappeared. . . .

On a second occasion that summer, the angel appeared to them again. During the siesta hours, the children remained in the shade under the trees near the well playing their games. On this occasion the angel appeared suddenly right beside the children. He had a gentle rebuke for them: "What are you doing?" Those words must have made a very strong impression on the children because they responded very faithfully to the angel's second message: "Pray! Pray very much! The Hearts of <u>Iesus and Mary have designs of mercy on you. Offer prayers and</u> sacrifices constantly to the Most High.".... In addition to prayer, the angel mentioned the need to offer sacrifices. When Lucia asked him how they were to make sacrifices, the angel answered: "Make of everything you can a sacrifice, and offer it to God as an act of reparation for the sins by which He is offended, and in supplication for the conversion of sinners. You will thus draw down peace upon your country. I am its Angel Guardian, the Angel of Portugal. Above all, accept and bear with submission, the suffering which the Lord will send you."
