A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Be There . . .

Next Saturday evening, November 11, after the Vigil Mass, we will gather to celebrate God's goodness to us and to have an evening of fun, fellowship, and fundraising at our 13th Annual School Auction. I'm grateful for all of those who have labored lovingly to prepare for that annual event. In contrast to many school auctions, the cost is minimal to attend. We want this to be a parish event as well as a way to help us raise money to continue to form Disciples of Christ at Resurrection School. Please plan to join us after the Vigil Mass next Saturday. It's a great time and a great cause. And remember: Bid early and often!

Pray for Our Youth

Today at the Lansing Center, youth from around the diocese are gathered at the Lansing Center for the Diocesan Youth Conference today (November 5). As a diocese and as a parish, we want to help parents help their children have powerful encounters with the Living God. Retreats and conferences are helpful ways to foster such encounters. But those encounters are most likely to bear lasting fruit if the faith is modeled and lived in schools and, *most especially*, homes. As I mentioned a few weeks ago in my homily and bulletin articles, the faith-life of their parents is the biggest indicator of whether students will practice their faith when they go on to college and beyond. Let's pray for all families, that they will prioritize the life of faith in their homes, in their conversations with their children, and with friends and family. Investing in the faith life of children pays eternal dividends!

What It Looks Like: The Shema

Last week, I quoted the "Sh'ma Yisrael," a powerful Jewish prayer that is part of their morning and evening prayer services. The first part of the prayer is taken from Deuteronomy 6:4-9: "*Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD; and you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. And you shall bind them as a sign upon your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.*"

The Lord created us with rational minds and free wills so that we can respond to the commandments of God. He also makes clear in Deuteronomy that repetition is fundamentally important for learning. A week ago, I preached about the power of memorization. After that, someone emailed me to say that parents shouldn't reward children for memorizing scripture or other important things, as I had suggested. Rather, children should memorize things for the benefit of having learned it! Of course, on the most important level, I agree. What motivated my suggestion that parents even "pay" kids to memorize scripture was that it will pay dividends that they and their children may not be able to antici-

pate. The truth is that if we have memorized something, it is "ours" in a way that things we have to Google in order to "remember" is not. People memorize lyrics of songs without thinking about it, but I think we can agree that most lyrics are not quite as valuable as the scriptures!

Baptismal Promises

All of this reminds me of the power of the promises that parents & godparents make at a child's baptism. The celebrant explains the sober responsibility parents & godparents are taking upon themselves: *You have come here to present this child for baptism. By water and the Holy Spirit he/she is to receive the gift of new life from God, who is love. On your part, you must make it your constant care to bring him/her up in the practice of the faith. See that the divine life which God gives him/her is kept safe from the poison of sin, to grow always stronger in his heart.* That's obviously a very important commitment. The 1965 Vatican II Declaration "On Christian Education", 3 elaborates on this: "*Since parents have given children their life, they are bound by the most serious obligation to educate their offspring and therefore must be recognized as the primary and principal educators . . . Parents are the ones who must create a family atmosphere animated by love and respect for God and man, in which the well-rounded personal and social education of children is fostered. Hence the family is the first school of the social virtues that every society needs. It is particularly in the Christian family, enriched by the grace and office of the sacrament of matrimony, that children should be taught from their early years to have a knowledge of God according to the faith received in Baptism, to worship Him, and to love their neighbor.*"

As a parish, one of our core values is to be **practically supportive of all parents and families** as they fulfill their responsibilities to their children. We do so through our school, on Sundays, and other faith-formation opportunities and programs. As we live out our God-given roles, let's please keep each other in prayer. May we all one day get to heaven and help each other get to heaven, along with all the children God is pleased to call His own!

GUIDELINES FOR THE MASS INTENTION BOOK

One of the challenges we face at Resurrection is giving each Parish Family a chance to have Masses offered for their family members. We have a few guidelines that will help more parishioners schedule Masses for the intentions of their loved ones.

- There will be a limit of 6 Masses that any one parish family may request for the year, (up to 2 of these can be Sundays)
- Only 1 intention per Mass is allowed, per Church governance. **However**, to better accommodate the needs of our parishioners, we can list up to 3 first names with the same last name (i.e. John, Paul & Mary Smith) **OR** 2 last names (i.e. Jones & Smith Families)

A few notes to remember before requesting a Mass:

- One Sunday Mass per weekend is offered for the intention of the Parishioners of Resurrection
- Please have an alternate date and time in mind, in the event that your 1st choice is not available
- A \$10 stipend is due at the time of the Mass request (checks preferred, exact change only)
- All Mass intentions over 6 requests will be sent to a Mission assigned by the Diocese, to be said at their convenience

We do not want to discourage any parishioner from scheduling Masses for loved ones or other special intentions. However, we also want all parishioners to have equal opportunities to have their intentions prayed for. Thank you for your consideration and cooperation.
