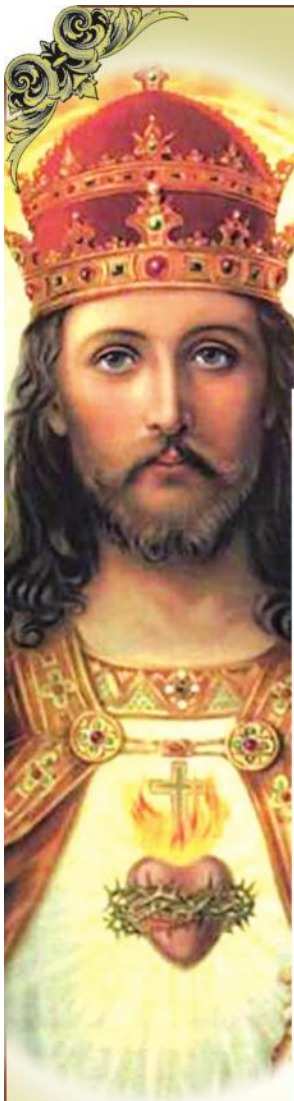

PARISH MISSION STATEMENT:

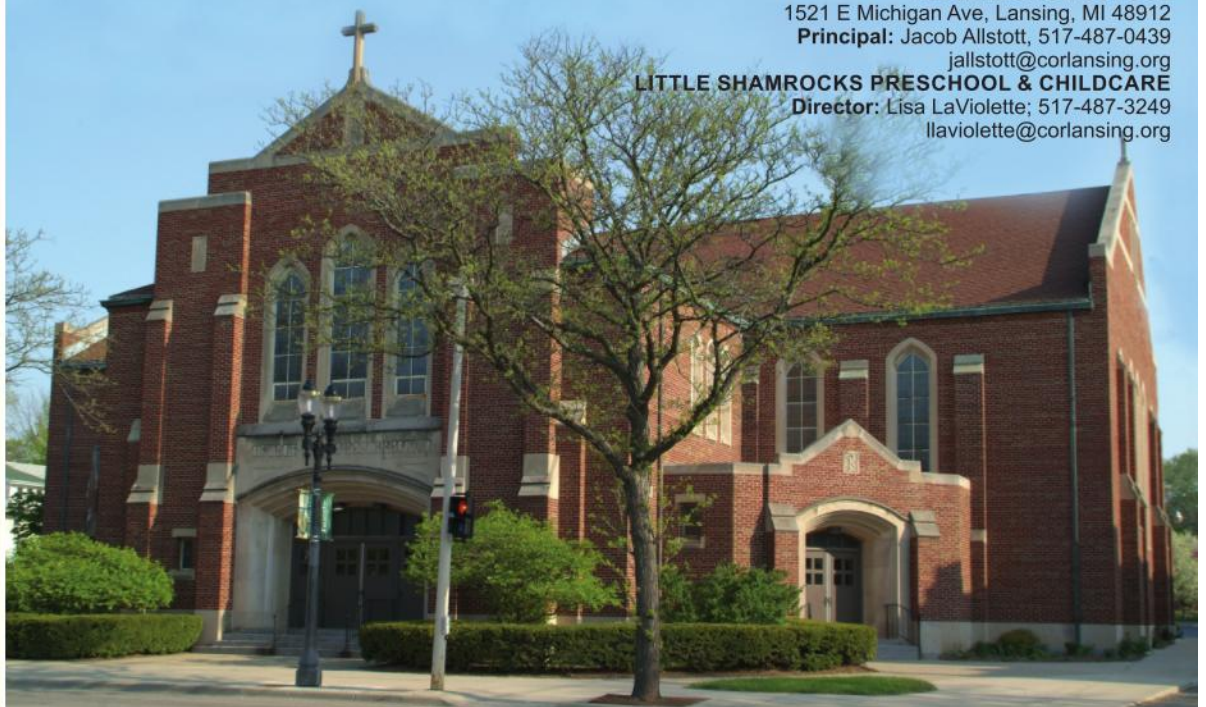

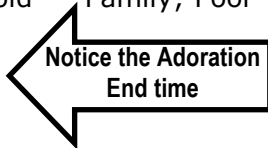

Please note the number of Extraordinary Ministers needed at each Mass, as we are now following Fr Steve's policy that was stated in last weeks bulletin.

“ Ministers at Mass

... I have prayerfully decided to limit the distribution of Communion to the Body even on weekends, except for Feasts or Solemnities. This means that we will only receive the Precious Blood on special occasions, like the Immaculate Conception, Christmas, Easter, Pentecost, Days of Obligation, etc. This will also allow ministers to enter into Mass more often, without having to serve every week. I hope that this change will reinforce the truth that our ministry is not primarily *at Mass*, but *after* or *outside of Mass*. Our liturgical minister schedule will reflect these changes, effective the First Sunday of Advent, which is in two weeks. “

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Jesus Christ is King!

We come to the end of our Liturgical Year by celebrating the Reign of God manifest in Jesus Christ our Lord and King. Our entire life as Christians is ordered to hope and anticipation of Christ's return and our own fellowship with Him in Heaven. Our home is in Heaven, and the King who is to come is our Brother, our Friend. If we walk always by His side, following Him, accompanying Him in our daily choices, we have no reason to fear His return. He will welcome us into His Father's House.

Advent Begins Next Sunday

What a great transition we find at this time of year! Right after we celebrate Christ's Kingship, we begin to anticipate His coming in three ways: His Incarnation (coming as a baby for us), His coming again in glory, and His coming in our hearts. It is a holy season of anticipation. To assist you in your preparation, please take a booklet filled with meditations for each day of Advent. May we all enter deeply into this great season of hope. Feel free to take a copy of the *Magnificat Advent Companion*, at the various exits.

Reminder about Ministers at Mass

As I stated last week in the bulletin, the primary place for most lay-men and -women to serve is outside/after Mass. Given that, as well as logistical challenges of ensuring we have enough EMHCs at Masses, I have prayerfully discerned that, beginning next week (First Sunday of Advent), we will distribute only the Body of Christ, except on Special Feasts and Solemnities. This change will allow many EMHCs to enter into Mass more prayerfully and more often, without having to serve every week (as many of them do).

"Grow and Go"

At Bishop Boyea's request, our parish along with all the other parishes is committing to sharing the Good News with our families and our friends, especially those who have left the active practice of the Catholic Faith. Here is the announcement that Bishop Boyea has asked to be made at every Mass:

Today marks the beginning of an exciting evangelization initiative in the Diocese of Lansing to further encourage parishes to create a culture of conversion, discipleship and evangelization. Inspired by Bishop Boyea's 2012 pastoral letter, the new GROW AND GO initiative invites you to continue to GROW as a disciple of Jesus and GO evangelize our world.

As a disciple of Christ, we are taught to GROW closer to him by praying every day, studying our faith, engaging in parish life and serving others' needs. We are also called to GO evangelize by praying for those who are separated from the Church, witnessing about Jesus, inviting people to church and accompanying them as they grow.

During Mass today, you will receive a Personal Evangelization Plan. This plan asks important questions

that will help you GROW in your faith, and GO evangelize. Please be sure to fill out the plan and prayerfully commit to cooperating in Jesus' Great Commission to bring the Gospel message to everyone we encounter.

This is the next step in our diocesan efforts to be more intentionally evangelistic. As pastor, I am pleased to be able to encourage everyone to prayerfully engage this initiative. As we begin our new liturgical year next week, let's keep each other in prayer, and then watch to see what the Lord will do in our parish and diocese. Come, Holy Spirit!

Spreading the Good News

A few weeks ago, I mentioned the importance of speaking up about our faith, given that you may be the only person who can reach a loved one about the truth we find in Christ. I stated that it was important for us to check ourselves, to ensure that when we share the truth we have in Christ, it is done with mercy, love, joy, and peace, and isn't in any way a screed or judgmental statement about the one we are hoping to help. The best way to prepare for sharing the Good News is by opening our hearts to receive God's love in prayer, sacraments, fellowship, and other "Encounter" opportunities, such as *Cursillo*, *Kairos*, *Alpha*, retreats & seminars, e.g., Healing the Whole Person, the Life in the Spirit Seminar, etc. If you have yet to come to know the love of God in a personal way, I invite you to reach out to me or someone else in your life to talk about what the best next steps might be. Advent is a great time for such new beginnings. The Lord wants all of us to know Him well. The most important prerequisite to sharing the Good News is accepting the Good News ourselves. That is, of course, the best way to "introduce" or "reintroduce" others to Jesus. This Advent, let's strive to know God's love and share that love with others each and every day.

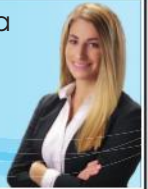

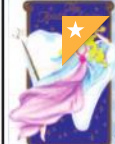

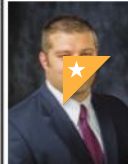
