A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

"Catholics Come Home"

Beginning this past Wednesday, you may have seen ads inviting viewers to "come home" to the Catholic Church. This is part of a diocesan effort to invite loved ones and friends to return (or come for the first time) to the Catholic Church. Please keep praying for your loved ones and friends who have left the Church, and consider ways that you might invite them to join you for Mass or another parish/school event. One of the most important things we can do in this holy season is bear witness in our lives to our faith, and to share our joy with others. Your friends and family are more likely to respond to your invitation than to an ad on TV, but this ad campaign give us, in a sense, "permission" to invite them to "come home."

Healing Encounter

One regular opportunity for us to invite people to "come home" is our bi-monthly "Healing Encounter." For a while now, every second Saturday of *even* months (December February, April, etc.), we have been offering an evening of praise, adoration, and prayers for healing. Consider joining us (and inviting someone to come along with you) this Saturday, December 9th. We will meet in the church at 7:00 p.m. and spend a couple of hours in the presence of the Lord. Each Encounter, we take time to pray, worship, and entreat Jesus to heal us. (If you have a candle that you've used before for the "Burning Bush," bring that with you. If you don't yet have a candle, come anyway. They will be available that evening.)

Dangers of Devices

Last week, I preached once again on the dangers of devices, and offered a strong invitation/exhortation/ encouragement to pull back from devices during Advent. This was a special Advent invitation, and I sense the Lord inviting all of us to create a space of "silence" in our hearts and homes. In my homily, which is available on our website (corlansing.org), I bore testimony to the increased freedom I have experienced that resulted from pulling significantly back from devices in my life. Though I don't think the Lord requires this of anyone, it has been really powerful for me.

Amusing Ourselves to Death

In my homily, I quoted from Neil Postman's 1985 Amusing Ourselves to Death, which outlined the dangers he believed TV posed for our culture and our lives. As I read the book, this excerpt was the most sobering for me: What [Aldous] Huxley teaches is that in the age of advanced technology, spiritual devastation is more likely to come from an enemy with a smiling face than from one whose countenance exudes suspicion and hate. In the Huxleyan prophecy, Big Brother does not watch us, by his choice. We watch him, by ours. We are all very much aware that devices are often used to pacify/entertain/ excite/satisfy ourselves and/or to do the same for others. Please note that I am not saying that devices are *intrinsically evil*. All technologies can be used for good or for evil. Nevertheless, I am convinced that devices often "rule" our lives as masters, rather than as servants. devices will affect the hearts, and minds of children.

Lumen Veritatis

This coming Saturday evening (December 16), Jim Owens will give our next *Lumen V eritatis* lecture, which is very timely in light of my homily last weekend. The lecture is entitled, "Neuroplasticity, Neurogenesis, & Human Flourishing." *Beginning with a discussion of how the brain establishes and develops neural pathways, Mr. Owens will provide principles by which each of us can pursue lives of true human flourishing. He will touch upon issues related to addiction, the dangerous effects of technology saturation (especially in young people), and the relationship between the development of virtue and neurological health.* The evening begins at 7:00 p.m. at the Lansing Catholic High School Auditorium with food, drinks, and fellowship. The talk will begin at 7:30 p.m. and will be followed by questions and answers. Please plan to join us. And bring a friend.

The Power of Silence: Against the Dictatorship of Noise

The other book I quoted from last week was Cardinal Robert Sarah's book on silence. It is very much worth a read, especially in this holy season. I offer here the excerpt from the book that I read at the 11:00 & 5:30 Masses:

...From morning to evening, from evening to morning, silence no longer has any place at all; the noise tries to prevent God himself from speaking. In this hell of noise, man disintegrates and is lost; he is broken up into countless worries, fantasies, and fears. In order to get out of these depressing tunnels, he desperately awaits noise so that it will bring him a few consolations. Noise is a deceptive, addictive, and false tranquilizer. <u>The tragedy of our world is never better summed up than in</u> the fury of senseless noise that stubbornly hates silence. This age detests the things that silence brings us to: encounter, wonder, and kneeling before God.

...In killing silence, man assassinates God. But who will help man to be quiet? His mobile phone is continually ringing; his fingers and mind are always busy sending messages.... Developing a taste for prayer is probably the first and foremost battle of our age. Stationed in garrisons of the most pitiful noises, is man prepared to return to silence? The death of silence is apparent. God will always help us to rediscover it.

As I concluded my reading of this quote, I added to the final part of the quote (*God will always help us to rediscover it* . . .) "<u>if we let Him</u>." Let's let Him!

May we all enter into silence and hear the still small voice of God this Advent,
