#### Welcome!

At this beautiful, joyful time of year, many people feel drawn to church. It is the Lord's love drawing us to the vulnerable Baby Jesus, who came among us as a sign of God's humility and love for us. If you're visiting or it has been a long time since you have been here, we're glad you're here! Perhaps you've seen the "Catholics Come Home" ads, or were invited by a friend or family member. For whatever reason you came, thanks for joining us. We want you to feel welcome, and we very much desire to support you (and your family) in any way we can.

#### Why We're Here . . .

The Church of the Resurrection is committed to spreading the Good News in word and deed, to living our faith in authentic ways, and supporting families (i.e., helping each other and our family members get to heaven). Mission-Focused, Authentically Catholic, and Supportive of Families are our parish "Core Values." Those values inform and shape our life and ministry as a parish, school, and community.

#### Come and See

Whether you are visiting, new to the parish, or have been here for a long time, you may be interested in a new initiative that we will begin in January. We are offering these bi-weekly meetings for those who would like to gather together outside of Mass. So, if you or someone you know would like to meet other parishioners, spend some time praying with each other, and have fellowship, please consider joining us (and perhaps bringing a friend or family member) for what we are calling "Come and See." We will begin these "Come and See" evenings on Wednesday January 10 at 7:00 p.m. in the old St. Vincent de Paul space at 123 Rumsey. #### Almost here!

Jesus is drawing near. This year, we have a very brief 4<sup>th</sup> week of Advent, just one day long, because Christmas is on a Monday this year. As we anticipate the celebration of Christ's birth, I want to say how grateful I am for the members of the Altar Society and their helpers who will help transform our sanctuary for a fitting celebration of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, beginning this evening. Thanks also to all those who have helped us worship so beautifully and well this season, and for the various ministers who allow us to enter into the Sacred Liturgy so effectively. I hope you find that worship here is truly worship in "spirit and in truth," beautifully and reverently celebrated. That is, at least our goal. Thanks to all those who help make it possible. God bless us all during this quick transition between Advent and Christmas!

### **Spreading the Good News at Christmas**

Beginning this (Sunday) evening, we will celebrate one of our Church's highest feasts, the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ. It is a time of year when many of us feel especially drawn to church. So, even if your family and friends don't typically come to Mass, they may feel the urge to come to church. Take a "risk" and invite them. Of course, give them the freedom to say no. But, if we don't ask, there's less chance that they will come. You have credibility with your family and friends. Love them enough this year to invite them to join you as we gather together to rejoice in Our Newborn King.

#### Christmas & New Year's Mass Schedule

On Christmas Eve, there will be Masses at 5:30 and Midnight (prelude music will begin at 11:30 p.m.). On Christmas Day, there

will be two Masses at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Each day this week, we will have the Masses of the Octave of Christmas. Next Sunday, December 31st, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Then, that evening we will celebrate the Vigil of the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, which is also the "Octave Day of Christmas." We will have two Vigil Masses, one at 5:30 p.m. and the other at 10:30 p.m. (NOTE the time change from prior years) followed by adoration, and Benediction just prior to Midnight. On January 1<sup>st</sup>, we will have one Mass at 10:00 a.m.

#### Sanctuary Renderings by Thomas Rajkovich

As I write this bulletin article on December 15, I am hopeful that we will have renderings that represent what the Master Planning Committee has concluded represents the best scheme for our sanctuary. When this committee saw Tom's initial renderings, we got excited because he proposed something that seems to really "fit" the building, and, at the same time, effectively invites us into the Heavenly Liturgy. It is our sense that the two side chapels would have statues of St. Gabriel and St. Raphael. The Archangel Gabriel announced the Good News to Mary, and can help us more effectively proclaim the Saving Message of the Gospel. The Archangel Raphael, the Patron of Healing, can help us experience the Healing Love of God.

#### Stav Tuned . . .

We will be scheduling a town-hall meeting to talk more about these renderings in early 2018, to get feedback, answer questions and address concerns. Thank you to all who have pledged and given funds to the Witness to Hope campaign, which will make this effort, and the second project, the secure, accessible connection between the schools possible. May we continue to seek God's leading and to do His work in our homes, parish, and community!

#### **Merry Christmas!**

May you and those you love experience the joy and peace of this holy season, and know the love of God made flesh in the person of the Baby Jesus. When you come to Mass on Christmas and throughout the Octave of Christmas, copies of the book by Matthew Kelly will be available in the narthex of the church. In this Liturgical Year, I pray we will all grow in our awareness of God's healing love, and open ourselves more and more to God's healing action in our hearts this year—for our own sake and for the sake of those we love. Feel free to take a copy or more to give to friends or loved ones who were unable to join us for worship this Christmas. In that way, we can all help spread the faith.


