# A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

#### Town Hall Meeting (Sunday at 3:00 p.m.)

As I mentioned last weekend, we will have a town hall meeting in Mercy Hall Sunday at 3:00 p.m. at which Tom Rajkovich will give a presentation of a new proposal for the sanctuary renovation. Please join us. After his presentation, there will be time for questions. I look forward to sharing this proposal with you, which, as I said last week, seems a much better fit architecturally with our church than the original Granda renderings which we showed last year. It also has a very interesting resemblance to the original proposal for the main church, which was drawn in 1937 but never built (the drawing showed the gym below the church, which we now know was built on the first floor of the 1939 high school building). I suspect Monsignor Gabriels would be quite pleased with what we are proposing now.

#### **Diocesan Services Appeal 2018**

Let me again say "Thank you" again for your generous response to the Witness to Hope Campaign last year. As you may recall, the Witness to Hope Campaign included the funds that would have been raised by the DSA in 2017. We are conducting DSA 2018 now because the diocese needs to cover ongoing costs of the diocesan staff and services throughout the ten counties of the diocese. This year, our parish DSA goal is \$72,386. I want to acknowledge that I know that many of us are making ongoing payments on our Witness to Hope pledge, and that some of us stretched ourselves to give generously to that appeal. Please know that Bishop Boyea is grateful for your generous support of the diocese, as am I for your support of our efforts here. The bishop invites you/us to prayerfully discern what we might be able to give this year to the DSA. #### Catechism on the Magisterium and Dei Verbum 10

As I mentioned last week in my homily, I am including texts that I quoted last week in my homily. First, from the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

**888** Bishops, with priests as co-workers, have as their first task "to preach the Gospel of God to all men," in keeping with the Lord's command.<sup>415</sup> They are "heralds of faith, who draw new disciples to Christ; they are authentic teachers" of the apostolic faith "endowed with the authority of Christ."<sup>416</sup>

**889** In order to preserve the Church in the purity of the faith handed on by the apostles, Christ who is the Truth willed to confer on her a share in his own infallibility. By a "supernatural sense of faith" the People of God, under the guidance of the Church's living Magisterium, "unfailingly adheres to this faith."

**890**.... It is this Magisterium's task to preserve God's people from deviations and defections and to guarantee them the objective possibility of professing the true faith without error. Thus, the pastoral duty of the Magisterium is aimed at seeing to it that the People of God abides in the truth that liberates. To fulfill this service, Christ endowed the Church's shepherds with the charism of infallibility in

matters of faith and morals. The exercise of this charism takes several forms:

**891** "The Roman Pontiff, head of the college of bishops, enjoys this infallibility in virtue of his office, when, as supreme pastor and teacher of all the faithful - who confirms his brethren in the faith he proclaims by a definitive act a doctrine pertaining to faith or morals. . . . The infallibility promised to the Church is also present in the body of bishops when, together with Peter's successor, they exercise the supreme Magisterium," above all in an Ecumenical Council.<sup>418</sup> When the Church through its supreme Magisterium proposes a doctrine "for belief as being divinely revealed,"<sup>419</sup> and as the teaching of Christ, the definitions "must be adhered to with the obedience of faith."<sup>420</sup> This infallibility extends as far as the deposit of divine Revelation itself.<sup>421</sup>

#### And from Dei Verbum (Divine Revelation) 10:


Th[e] Magisterium is not above the Word of God, but serves it, teaching only what has been handed on, listening to it devoutly, guarding it scrupulously, and explaining it faithfully in accord with a dine commission, and with the help of the Holy Spirit, it draws from this one deposit of faith everything which it presents for belief as divinely revealed.
