

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Great Free Resource: formed.org

For a few years now, our parish has subscribed to a Catholic formation online portal called "formed.org". If you haven't yet explored the resources, I would definitely encourage you to do so. It provides excellent resources about the Catholic faith, and includes book studies, audio talks, and other, high quality video materials, including quite a few faith-based movies. There is a link from our website. We have a parish/school code, which will give you access to the website. Our "Parish Code" is 760716. The digit after the "f" is a zero, not an "O.") You will create your own account, using your email address, and then enter the parish code to gain access. If you are a Mac user, I would recommend using Chrome or another browser, rather than Safari. In coming weeks, I will give information about a particular series. I would heartily recommend the new series on the Eucharist called "Presence."

God Gives Gifts!

Last week, I preached about God's ongoing healing power in our midst, and mentioned that the Lord gives all the baptized gifts, which the Lord longs for us to "joyfully use . . . "for the building up the Kingdom of God and the salvation of souls," as we've been praying for years. A few weeks ago, I mentioned the very encouraging words of Blessed John Henry Newman, which highlight the importance of each and every one of us. It's my desire that we would all know the power of his words:

We are all created to [God's] glory—we are created to do His will. I am created to do something or to be something for which no one else is created; I have a place in God's counsels, in God's world, which no one else has; whether I be rich or poor, despised or esteemed by man, God knows me and calls me by my name. God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission Somehow I am necessary for His purposes, as necessary in my place as an Archangel in his I have a part in this great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connexion between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place . . . if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling. (Blessed John Henry Newman)

You Have Gifts!

Not only does each of us has his/her place, and his/her mission. We are also each given gifts. This is how St. Paul puts it:

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I do not want you to be uninformed. there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpreta-

tion of tongues. All these are inspired by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills. (I Cor. 12:1-11)

Upcoming "Two Days of Equipping" for Ministry Training

If you're curious about how to discern and use the gifts God has given you, consider joining us for an upcoming event in early August. Last September, we were blessed to have the team from the John Paul II Healing Center come to present the *Healing the Whole Person* retreat. I am pleased to announce that Bart Schuchts, Bob's brother, who was here last year, will come in early August to offer us a two day (Friday evening and Saturday) conference on using our spiritual gifts for ministry. The description of the program on the JPII Healing Center website is as follows:

This training will help you to live a more dynamic and powerful faith. You'll learn how God uniquely speaks to you, and what it means to live in the fullness of Confirmation! Activities include prayer for the release of the Holy Spirit, learning to hear His voice, and practicing praying for others for healing. During this fast-paced training, you will experience the supernatural grace and power that Jesus shared with the apostles, and intends for us today! Next Steps: Connect Groups

One of the reasons we offered the Life in the Spirit seminar this year was to create another opportunity for members of the parish to experience an "encounter opportunity" that we have made a prerequisite for becoming part of a "Connect Group" at the parish. We currently have two Connect Groups, and are looking to begin one or more additional groups in the fall. These mid-sized groups offer an opportunity to again experience some of the best elements of Alpha; eating together, prayer, open sharing, and friendship. 
> Enrollment as of June 25th: 145 students enrolled, 10 expected to re-enroll, 6 prospective, and 1 waitlisted. There are also more families continuing to contact the school each week. We have reached a waitlist in 1st grade and 8th grade. Kindergarten, 2nd and 5th grade may also reach a waitlist this year based on the addition of prospective and re-enrolled students. We are still estimating 155-165 students for this coming fall, which would be an increase of 8-15 students from last year.


