A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

50th Anniversary of Humanae Vitae

This coming Wednesday, July 25th, marks the 50th anniversary of the Papal Encyclical Humanae Vitae. It was written by Blessed Pope Paul VI and was subtitled "On the Regulation of Birth." It re-affirmed the orthodox teaching of the Catholic Church regarding married life, responsible parenthood, and the rejection of artificial contraception. In formulating his teaching he explained why he did not accept the conclusions of the *Pontifical* Commission on Birth Control established by his predecessor, St. Pope John XXIII, a commission he himself had expanded. Mainly because of its prohibition of most forms (some licit therapeutic procedures with sole intent to cure bodily diseases are excepted) of artificial contraception, the encyclical was, to put it mildly, politically controversial. It affirmed traditional Church moral teaching on the sanctity of life and the procreative and unitive nature of conjugal relations. Blessed Pope Paul VI made four rather general "prophecies" about what would happen if the Church's teaching on human life were ignored.

- Infidelity and moral decline. The Pope first noted that the widespread use of contraception would "lead to conjugal infidelity and the general lowering of morality."
- Lost Respect for Women. Blessed Paul VI also argued that "the man" will lose respect for "the woman" and "no longer (care) for her physical and psychological equilibrium" and will come to "the point of considering her as a mere instrument of selfish enjoyment and no longer as his respected and beloved companion."
- Abuse of Power. Pope Paul also observed that the widespread acceptance of contraception would place a "dangerous weapon... in the hands of those public authorities who take no heed of moral exigencies."

Unlimited Dominion. Pope Paul's final warning was that contraception would lead man to think that he had unlimited dominion over his own body. Sterilization is now the most widely used form of contraception in the U.S.; individuals are so convinced of their rights to control their own bodies that they do not hesitate to alter even their own physical make-up.

Blessed Pope Paul VI also acknowledged that spouses might have difficulty in acquiring the self-discipline necessary to practice the methods of family planning that require periodic abstinence. But he taught that self-discipline was possible, especially with the help of sacramental grace. In Section 21, he wrote:

....the discipline which is proper to the purity of married couples, far from harming conjugal love, rather confers on it a higher human value. It demands continual effort yet, thanks to its beneficent influence, husband and wife fully develop their personalities, being enriched with spiritual values. Such discipline bestows upon family life fruits of serenity and peace; and facilitates the solution of other problems; it favors attention for one's partner, helps both parties to drive out selfishness, the enemy of true love, and deepens their sense of responsibility.

Pope Paul VI's encyclical was surprising at the time, but has proved particularly prophetic over time. It has not been received by most couples, largely, I believe, because bishops and priests have not taught this. I think that's largely because we have often failed to be as prophetic as Blessed Pope Paul VI was. My prayer is that preachers would preach about it, and that all Catholics,

young and old, would open their hearts to the beautiful, countercultural message of human sexuality that the Church has always offered.

"Two Days of Equipping" for Ministry Training

August 3rd & 4th, we will have training for ministry, as I stated last weekend in my homily, a call for all of the baptized. I'm hopeful that we will all be able to utilize our gifts for the building up of the kingdom of God. The description of the program on the JPII Healing Center website is as follows: This training will help you to live a more dynamic and powerful faith. You'll learn how God uniquely speaks to you, and what it means to live in the fullness of Confirmation! Activities include prayer for the release of the Holy Spirit, learning to hear His voice, and practicing praying for others for healing. During this fast-paced training, you will experience the supernatural grace and power that Jesus shared with the apostles, and intends for us today! We have a link to the registration page on our website. Call the office if you have questions (482-4749). If finances are an issue, please let us know. I hope to see many of you there. It promises to be a powerful and encouraging event.

Evening of Renewal/Prayer Meeting

From 7:00 to 8:30 or so on August 4th, we will have an "Evening of Renewal." The evening will consist of a time of Praise and Worship, then a talk by Bart Schuchts, from the John Paul II Healing Center in Florida. This is a wonderful opportunity to experience the freedom of praising God together, using the charismatic gifts of the Spirit, and being enriched by the word of God. I will be leading the evening and the event will take place in the church.

Some Days Away

I will be taking a bit of vacation this coming week. I will be away through next weekend. I have tried to get coverage for all the Masses, but, despite my efforts, I have not yet been able to get coverage for Tuesday evening Mass, confession, and Benediction or Friday morning. We continue to try to find coverage. Even if there is no Mass or confessions, there will be devotions on Tuesday evening at 6:15, as usual. And Bob Murrell said that he would lead the Rosary, if Mass was canceled. Note that we will put a sign on the door with options for Mass if, in fact, we have to cancel the Masses and confession opportunities next week. Friday evening, we will have adoration at least from 7-8 p.m., with confessions and Benediction. If we are able to find Mass coverage for Friday morning, we will have adoration throughout the day, as usual. Finally, because I will be away, the monthly women's Evening of Adoration is canceled this month. Be assured of my prayers for you as I travel. Please keep me in prayer, as well.


