

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

#### In Light of the Current Crisis . . .

If you were not here last weekend, I preached about the current priest/bishop scandal, and what I believe is the Lord's work of exposing the structures of secrecy and sin in the clerical culture of our Church. I long for the Light of Christ to shine, for sin to be exposed, and that those who have caused pain and covered for the sins of others will repent and that justice will be done. Please pray. We also, of course, need to forgive those who have scandalized the faithful, lest bitterness and anger get the better of us. Anger is appropriate, to be sure, but we can allow a spirit of vengeance to overtake us, which is not pleasing to God. Please pray for all priests and bishops, for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit and a renewed desire to live in the light and abide in the One Who Is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. You can hear the homily on our website.

### Living in the Light

Last weekend, I quoted from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, which should offers clear guidelines for cleaning up the household of God, beginning with priests and bishops:

Let no one deceive you with empty arguments, for because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the disobedient. So do not be associated with them. For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth. Try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord. Take no part in the fruitless works of darkness; rather expose them, for it is shameful even to mention the things done by them in secret; but everything exposed by the light becomes visible, for everything that becomes visible is light. Ephesians 5:6-13

#### What We Can Do

As I said this weekend, we may not be able to address matters elsewhere, but we can focus on being Who we are in Christ here in the Heart of Lansing. I need to grow in holiness more and more so that I can help you and those you love become Whole and Holy in Him. We also need to recommit—to double-down, as it were—on our Core Values, which are the following:

- 1)We are <u>mission-focused</u>. This means we seek to spread the Gospel with joy, to create opportunities for people to encounter the Love of God in Jesus, and to help them grow in maturity as disciples of Christ.
- 2) We are <u>authentically Catholic</u>. This means we embrace and teach the Truth as we find it in and through the Church; we worship in spirit and truth in a way that is both reverent and beautiful; we foster a truly Catholic culture; and we seek to live lives marked by Stewardship.
- 3) We are <u>supportive of families</u>. This means we commit to partnering with parents and supporting them in their role as the primary educators of their children in the ways of faith; we seek ways to strengthen marriages; and we provide other practical supports for families.

May we evermore live out our core values and serve our community, here in the heart of Lansing. Amen.

### **All Night Adoration**


