

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Made for Happiness

Many thanks to all those who helped contribute to the very successful "mid-way point" of the Eucharistic Procession last weekend. I can't tell you how powerful it was to be privileged to carry the Monstrance with the Blessed Sacrament during the procession as it passed by our parish, school, convent, and office. The thousands who journeyed with Jesus in the streets of Lansing in testimony to our belief in Jesus present Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity was a wonderful memory for all those who were privileged to be part of it, and a witness to those who saw us. May our faith sustain us in these challenging times, and may the Eucharist be a source of strength for us in our pilgrimage journey!

Breslin Center Hosts a "Solemn Assembly"

Whether you joined us at the Breslin Center, were able to catch a bit of it on Ave Maria Radio, or watched on the internet, you know that the day included a penitential time of prayer at the end of the Eucharistic Procession, and then time of praise, three talks, concluding with Mass. The concourse featured information about a host of ministries, and the day was a great celebration of the Catholic faith we have as members of the Church of Lansing. Personally the most powerful for me among the speakers was the last one, Deacon Larry Oney. It might have been most powerful because we priests were seated right in front of him, in anticipation of our concelebration of the Mass. As much as anything, he played the prophet to us, and encouraged us to respond to what he called our "situation." Indeed, we are in a "situation." His scripturepacked talk centered on the great text from the Prophet Joel, which he hammered home to us. Here is the text of Joel 2. from which he focused heavily on the verses I've underlined:

For the day of the LORD is great and very terrible; who can endure it? [12] "Yet even now," says the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; [13] and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and repents of evil. [14] Who knows whether he will not turn and repent, and leave a blessing behind him, a cereal offering and a drink offering for the LORD, your God?

[15] Blow the trumpet in Zion; sanctify a fast; call a solemn assembly; [16] gather the people. Sanctify the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. [17] Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, "Spare thy people, O LORD, and make not thy heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations.

Why should they say among the peoples, `Where is their God?'" [18] Then the LORD became jealous for his land, and had pity on his people. [19] The LORD answered and said to his people, "Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil, and you will be satisfied; and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations.

His reminder that we are called to gather together, to weep for our sins, and to remember that we are God's People, empowered by Him to be salt, light, and leaven. That was what I needed to hear, and what I need to remember as we continue in this time of sanctification. Come, Holy Spirit, purify Your Church!




