A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Lumen Veritatis

This Saturday evening (October 20th), Sr. Stephen Patrick, O.P., will give our next *Lumen Veritatis* lecture, which is entitled, "The God Gene: Encountering Beauty In Molecular Biology." Sister Stephen Patrick Joly, O.P. joined the Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist in 2005 and celebrated 10 years of religious profession this summer. This year, she was reassigned to Lansing Catholic High School where she is teaching Honors and General Chemistry. She is the superior of the Lansing Mission. The evening will begin at 7:00 p.m. in Mercy Hall (127 Rumsey, please note the location change) with food, drinks, and fellowship. The talk will begin at 7:30 p.m. and will be followed by questions and answers. Please plan to join us. And bring a friend.

Year of Prayer

As I mentioned two weeks ago, Bishop Boyea has announced a "Year of Prayer" for "Forming Missionary Disciples." There are cards with this prayer at the exits of the church. The text of the prayer, which we will be praying at Masses in future weeks is the following:

Father, You invite each of us to share in the life and ministry of your Son, Jesus. Send your Holy Spirit to form our parish as a community of missionary disciples. Teach us how to hear Jesus, to love Jesus, and to share your gift of salvation with everyone we meet. Through the witness and intercession of Mary, guide me to deepen my commitment as a disciple of Jesus. Lead our parish to grow as an intentional community, committed to go and announce the Gospel of the Lord. We ask these blessings in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Evangelii Nuntiandi (On Evangelization in the Modern World)Pope St. Paul VI, as I mentioned last Sunday, wrote a very important Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation. I quoted portions of the document, which I reproduce here:

13. Those who sincerely accept the Good News, through the power of this acceptance and of shared faith therefore gather together in Jesus' name in order to seek together the kingdom, build it up and live it. They make up a community which is in its turn evangelizing. The command to the Twelve to go out and proclaim the Good News is also valid for all Christians, though in a different way....Those who have received the Good News and who have been gathered by it into the community of salvation can and must communicate and spread it.

14. The Church knows this. She has a vivid awareness of the fact that the Savior's words, "I must proclaim the Good News of the kingdom of God,"[34] apply in all truth to herself: She willingly adds with St. Paul: "Not that I boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty that has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it"[35] It is with joy and consolation that at the end of the great Assembly of 1974 we heard these illuminating words:

"We wish to confirm once more that the task of evangelizing all people constitutes the essential mission of the Church." [36] It is a task and mission which the vast and profound changes of present-day society make all the more urgent. Evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize, that is to


say, in order to preach and teach, to be the channel of the gift of grace, to reconcile sinners with God, and to perpetuate Christ's sacrifice in the Mass, which is the memorial of His death and glorious resurrection.

The Church is born of the evangelizing activity of Jesus and the Twelve. She is the normal, desired, most immediate and most visible fruit of this activity: "Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations."[37]....[I]t is above all His mission and His condition of being an evangelizer that she is called upon to continue.[39] For the Christian community is never closed in upon itself. The intimate life of this community - the life of listening to the Word and the apostles' teaching, charity lived in a fraternal way, the sharing of bread[40] this intimate life only acquires its full meaning when it becomes a witness, when it evokes admiration and conversion, and when it becomes the preaching and proclamation of the Good News. Thus it is the whole Church that receives the mission to evangelize, and the work of each individual member is important for the whole.

-The Church is an evangelizer, but she begins by being evangelized herself. She is the community of believers, the community of hope lived and communicated, the community of brotherly love, and she needs to listen unceasingly to what she must believe, to her reasons for hoping, to the new commandment of love.

As I mentioned last Sunday (and, if you missed my homily, I very much encourage you to listen to it online), I know that I need to strive to help us all be "evangelized ourselves," and to offer helpful, practical ways to be "Missionary Disciples" after the pattern of St. Paul and all those faithful Christians whose witness and words fostered our own lives of faith. Please do, in fact, pray daily for me, for my brother priests, for Bishop Boyea, and for all bishops and our Holy Father, that we would be good shepherds who know how to evangelize and make disciples, as the Lord commanded us in the "Great Commission."


Resurrection School's 14th Annual **Live/Silent Auction**




