

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Be There . . .

Next Saturday evening, November 3rd, after the Vigil Mass, we will gather to celebrate God's goodness to us and to have an evening of fun, fellowship, and fundraising at our 14th Annual School Auction. I'm grateful for all of those who have labored lovingly to prepare for that annual event. In contrast to many school auctions, the cost is minimal to attend. We want this to be a parish event as well as a way to help us raise money to continue to form Disciples of Christ at Resurrection School. Please plan to join us after the Vigil Mass next Saturday. It's a great time and a great cause. And remember: Bid early and often!

Moving Music

I am very grateful and count myself blessed that the music at our parish is as edifying and beautiful as it is. Thank you to all those who participate in the choir, scholas, and/or other ensembles, who help us pray beautifully at Mass. In the interest of allowing us all to enter more deeply into worship, this Tuesday, we plan to move the piano and ensembles to the rear of the church. This will eliminate any potential distraction by the musicians and singers at Mass, and will eliminate any possible impression that those who help us sing at Mass are in any way "performing" for us.

Making Room for this Move

This change will, however, require the elimination of some pews. As we reflected about it, the best location, we decided, is the angled section of pews in the southwest corner of the church. I know that some of you have found those pews particularly comfortable, and I apologize that we need to remove any pews to make space for the piano and ensembles. Please know that I realize that this will be difficult for some of you, and you are likely to feel displaced. I hope and pray that others will "open up *their* pews" for you! In fact, I'm sure they will.

Year of Prayer

In this "Year of Prayer" for Missionary Disciples, it makes a lot of sense for us to take some time to focus together on how it is that we can and should pray. There are many ways to pray, and the Lord delights in us when we choose to take time to pray. With the goal of fostering greater prayer in our lives, during Advent and as we begin the new year, we are going to be offering opportunities to learn more about prayer, in the great Catholic spiritual traditions. Stay tuned for more information in coming weeks.

Prayer and Desire

In light of this Sunday's Gospel passage, however, it seems opportune to take a bit of time to muse about prayer "from the heart." What does it mean? As a brief reflection, consider what St. Augustine wrote about prayer in his "Letter to Proba": Why God should ask us to pray, when he knows what we need before we ask him, may perplex us if we do not realize that our Lord and God does not want to know what we want (for he cannot fail to know it) but wants us rather to exercise our desire through our prayers, so that we may be able to receive what he is preparing to give us. His gift is very great indeed, but our capacity is too small and limited to receive it. That is why we are told: Enlarge your desires.

The Example of Blind Bartimaeus

We can see this heart-felt prayer motivated by desire operative in the encounter of Bartimaeus with Jesus:

They came to Jericho. And as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, he is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. (Mark 10:46-52)

The question for you and me to imagine in our time of prayer is what we would say if Jesus asked us what he asked Bartimaeus, i.e., what we want Jesus to do for us, and then to imagine prayerfully what He is saying and doing for us in response to our heartfelt prayer. Let's grow in prayer this year together. Amen!

All Hallows Eve & the Solemnity of All Saints

All Saints Day is Thursday, November 1, when we celebrate all the saints who have gained access to the everlasting beatitude of heaven. All Saints Day is a <u>Holy Day of Obligation</u>, which means that all Catholics are expected to attend Mass to celebrate the Saints who have gone before us. We will have three All Saint's Masses, a (school) Mass at 8:15 a.m. Mass, at 12:00 noon, and another at 7:00 p.m.

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls)

November 2 is All Souls Day, when we pray for all our beloved dead, that they will be purified of any attachments to the things of earth. We will have our normally scheduled 8:15 a.m. Mass and a second Mass at 6:30 p.m. that evening. We commend those who have gone before us to the merciful fire of God's redeeming love to perfect those we love. Our loved ones benefit from our prayers and sacrifices on their behalf. Lord, have mercy on all who have died. And may their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace! Amen.

This school year, we replaced the world language component of our curriculum with Latin. We are truly blessed to have Mrs. Ana Henebry teaching Latin to our students. She is a vibrant teacher with a tremendous amount of instructional experience. There are many benefits to the study of Latin. One skill I have witnessed our students recently use is the decoding of a word and determining its meaning by dissecting its morpheme components and comparing it to other English words with similar Latin derivatives. I watched this happen many times last week during the NWEA tests, and students were able to analyze the word in question and deduce the correct answer. I am very pleased to see how quickly the students have acquired this skill. It will help them in demonstrating mastery of the English language and support them in future studies. I am excited to be able to offer our students Latin and grateful for the prayers of our parishioners, which helped us find such a wonderful teacher, in Mrs. Henebry.

2019 GUIDELINES FOR SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Mass stipends are \$10 and are to be paid when requesting Masses. Payable by check or exact change only.
- Limit of 6 Masses per parish family may be requested for the year, (up to 2 of these can be for the Sunday obligation)
- Only 1 intention per Mass is allowed, per Canon Law. However, to better accommodate the needs of our parishioners, we can list up to 2 first names with the same last name (i.e. John & Mary Smith) **OR** 2 last names (i.e. Jones & Smith Families)
- No Mass will be permanently affixed in the Mass Book until the stipend is received.
 - ° The first stipend received is assigned the date.


SPECIAL NOTES TO REMEMBER
