#### **Holy Land Touch of Art**

Holy Land Touch of Art is a business of families that live in the Holy Land and will be visiting our parish next weekend, Nov 10 & 11. For centuries, the wood carving industry has been the main industry for the Christians of the Holy Land and has allowed Christian families to earn a living by selling to visiting pilgrims. Due to the dramatic decrease in the number of visiting pilgrims, it has been very difficult for the Artisans to support their families and community. Because of the lack of work in the Holy Land, there has been a dramatic rise in Christian emigration from the Holy Land. Sadly now, Christians make up less than 1% of the population. Since the start of its ministry three years ago with the blessing of Bishop Boyea, Holy Land Touch of Art has helped up to 75 struggling families. #### **Knowing God's Commands**

This week, we hear the "Sh'ma Yisrael," the powerful Jewish prayer that is part of their morning and evening services. The first part of the prayer is taken from Deuteronomy 6:4-9: "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD; and you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. And you shall bind them as a sign upon your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."

The Lord created us with rational minds and free wills so that we can respond to the commandments of God. He also makes clear in Deuteronomy that repetition is fundamentally important for learning.

#### **Baptismal Promises**

All of this reminds me of the power of the promises that parents & godparents make at a child's baptism. The celebrant explains the sober responsibility parents & godparents are taking upon themselves: You have come here to present this child for baptism. By water and the Holy Spirit he/she is to receive the gift of new life from God, who is love. On your part, you must make it your constant care to bring him/her up in the practice of the faith. See that the divine life which God gives him/her is kept safe from the poison of sin, to grow always stronger in his heart.

That's obviously a very important commitment. The 1965 Vatican II Declaration "On Christian Education", 3 elaborates on this: "Since parents have given children their life, they are bound by the most serious obligation to educate their offspring and therefore must be recognized as the primary and principal educators... Parents are the ones who must create a family atmosphere animated by love and respect for God and man, in which the well-rounded personal and social education of children is fostered. Hence the family is the first school of the social virtues that every society needs. It is particularly in the Christian family, enriched by the grace and office of the sacrament of matrimony, that children should be taught from their early years to have a knowledge of God according to the faith received in Baptism, to worship Him, and to love their neighbor."

As a parish, one of our core values is to be **practically supportive of all parents and families** as they fulfill their responsibilities to their children. We do so through our school, on Sundays, and other faith-formation opportunities and programs. As we live out our God-given roles, let's please keep each other in prayer. May we all one day get to heaven and help each other get to heaven, along with all the children God is pleased to call His own!

# 2019 GUIDELINES FOR SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

#### POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Mass stipends are \$10 and are to be paid when requesting Masses. Payable by check or exact change only.
- Limit of 6 Masses per parish family may be requested for the year, (up to 2 of these can be for the Sunday obligation)
- Only 1 intention per Mass is allowed, per Canon Law. However, to better accommodate the needs of our parishioners, we can list up to 2 first names with the same last name (i.e. John & Mary Smith) **OR** 2 last names (i.e. Jones & Smith Families)
- No Mass will be permanently affixed in the Mass Book until the stipend is received.
  - The first stipend received is assigned the date.


### SPECIAL NOTES TO REMEMBER


