I very much encourage people to take the time to "Be Healed" over these three days. Please share the information with those you know and love. As I preached last week, healing encounters with the living love of God can help all of us deal with the various challenges of life.

Praying for the Dead

Last weekend, I talked about the importance of the tradition of praying for the dead. November is the time when the Church has traditionally focused on praying for our loved ones who have died. Here is what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says about Purgatory. It's worth reflection.

III. THE FINAL PURIFICATION, OR PURGATORY

1030 All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. 1031 The Church gives the name <u>Purgatory</u> to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned.⁶⁰⁶ The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire:⁶⁰⁷ As for certain lesser faults, we must believe that, before the Final Judgment, there is a purifying fire. He who is truth says that whoever utters blasphemy against the Holy Spirit will be pardoned neither in this age nor in the age to come. From this sentence we understand that certain offenses can be forgiven in this age, but certain others in the age to come.⁶⁰⁸

Funerals and Prayer for the Dead

As I mentioned last week in my homily and also on All Souls Day, priests are given the option to wear white, violet, and black vestments for All Souls Day. Since I've been a priest, I have chosen to wear black vestments. It has been a powerful sign to me of both the need and the privilege to pray for the dead. Based on my experience, and my prayer and study, I am now convinced that there is a significant value to wearing black vestments and using a black pall for funerals here in the future. Because I know that this might be a bit shocking to some people, I will be developing a pamphlet to explain the value of wearing black vestments, which is primarily the message that we need to pray for our loved ones, so that they will be purified of any residual attachment to the things of earth. We are men and women of the Resurrection, people of Hope, but we also need to remember that prayer for the dead is one of the spiritual works of mercy. Catholic funerals can sometimes seem like mini-canonizations, which can give the false impression that there is no need to pray for the dead.

The clear teaching of the tradition is that we need to pray for all our loved ones who have died. I believe that wearing black vestments and using a black pall will help us all remember that our grief at the death of loved ones should lead to prayer, even as it is informed by our hope of the resurrection.

As St. Paul says in I Thessalonians 4:13: But we would not have you ignorant, brethren, concerning those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope.


