A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Happy New Year!

As we celebrate the new (liturgical) year and begin our Advent journey, I hope and pray that all of our hearts will be filled with joyful anticipation of Christ's three-fold coming: 1) His coming as a baby, the "Newborn King"; 2) His coming again in Glory; and 3) His coming into our hearts.

The Heavenly Liturgy

During the last two weeks of the liturgical year, we have been reading from the Book of Revelation at daily Mass. It's always a great reminder of the tremendous privilege we have every time we attend Mass. At Mass, we are invited into a tremendous mystery, a holy and awe-inspiring entry into the heavenly realms. In the Sacred Liturgy, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, heaven, as it were, comes to earth. The more our celebration of the Mass can be beautiful, reverent, and mysterious, the more we (and our children) will sense that the Mass is anything but "ordinary." Especially in this Holy Season, we will seek to focus on sacred silence and a more simple musical setting at Mass. The point is to be drawn into mystery when we celebrate the Mass. Consider, in this context, the vision of heaven John describes in the Book of Revelation:

Then I saw standing in the midst of the throne and the four living creatures and the elders, a Lamb that seemed to have been slain He came and received the scroll from the right hand of the one who sat on the throne. When he took it, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. Each of the elders held a harp and gold bowls filled with incense, which are the prayers of the holy ones. They sang a new hymn: "Worthy are you to receive the scroll and to break open its seals, for you were slain and with your blood you purchased for God those from every tribe and tongue, people and nation. You made them a kingdom and priests for our God, and they will reign on earth."

I looked again and heard the voices of many angels who surrounded the throne and the living creatures and the elders. They were countless in number, and they cried out in a loud voice: "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and blessing." Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, everything in the universe, cry out: "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever." The four living creatures answered, "Amen," and the elders fell down and worshiped. (Revelation 5:6-14)

Future Opportunity I (Men's Breakfasts)

Beginning this Wednesday, December 5, our parish will be hosting a weekly men's breakfast from 6:30 to 7:30 a.m. First Wednesdays of the month, including December 5, we will begin with Mass at 6:30. Then we will head over to Mercy Hall for breakfast and fellowship following. The other Wednesdays of the month, we will be in Mercy Hall. Doors for the hall will open at 6:15 a.m., and we'll wrap up each week by 7:30. Plan on joining us, brothers, if you're able, and invite others to join you.

Future Opportunity II (Basic Introduction to Christian Prayer)

Beginning Thursday evening, December 6, Brian Fink will offer a three week introduction to Christian Prayer, basing his talks on the first part of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The series will be held from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Thursdays in Mercy Hall (127 Rumsey). We will provide simple snacks and beverages. Brian is an excellent teacher, and I'm grateful that he will provide this series to the parish this Advent. There will be plenty of opportunity for questions and answers each week.

Future Opportunity III (All Night Adoration on December 14)

Plan ahead. We will have an evening of adoration through the night of December 14, concluding with Benediction at 7:30 a.m. on December 15th. You can sign up for an hour of prayer on the parish website. Let's be attentive to the Lord's voice this Advent. Adoration is a great opportunity to listen to God's voice.

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have three Masses to celebrate the Immaculate Conception, a Vigil Mass at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, and two Masses on Saturday, one at 8:15 a.m., and the other at noon. Please note that the evening Mass on Saturday is the Mass of the Second Sunday of Advent, and does not fulfill the obligation for the Holy Day. Note also that we will pray a Rosary after the noon Mass outside of the church on the front steps to celebrate the fact that *Jesus is the Reason for the Season*.

Come Encounter Jesus

Next Saturday, December 8th, we will have our next *Healing Encounter*. It is a time of praise, worship, prayer, and adoration from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. in the church. Prayer teams will be available to pray for healing and other requests. Come, and invite someone to join you.


