#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

#### Thank you!

I am writing this from Florida, where I am helping with and participating in a retreat with other priests and a few seminarians. It has been a great grace thus far. Thank you for your prayers for me. Please pray for the John Paul II Healing Center and the priests and seminarians who made the retreat with me, that the Lord would draw all of us into the heart of Holy Desire, which was the title of the retreat. As I said before I left for the retreat, nine priests from the Diocese of Lansing are on the retreat with me. I am blessed to be among such brothers, and to see what God is doing in our diocese and around the country. One thing that is very exciting is to see what God will do in our four diocesan high schools after this retreat. All four priest chaplains are here. Come, Holy Spirit! Please keep praying for us priests, that we would, in fact, know who we are and Whose we are. This day, when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, is a great day for all the baptized to contemplate God's goodness and our dignity as beloved children of the Father.

#### Sr. Miriam James

As was the case when we had the Healing the Whole Person Retreat here, Sr. Miriam is helping with the teaching of the material with Bob and Bart Schuchts. Yesterday, while she was presenting some material, she said something that seemed so obvious once she said it, but it struck me for its simple profundity:

"Christianity is not 'sin-management.' It is total transformation." I am convinced that Sister has put her finger on one of the most dangerous false-beliefs and temptations of those who are seeking to grow in the spiritual life: the notion that we need to do more, to perfect ourselves, etc., by our own efforts. The more we try, the more we realize that it just doesn't work. This week, as always when I'm with the JPII Healing Center team, and think about the work of healing, I am reminded that humble recognition of our brokenness is the prerequisite for real encounter with the living, healing, love of God. The team here does not pretend that they are something they are not. They are weak vessels, cracked, with limitations, which God delights and chooses to use for His glory. That's also true about you and me, indeed, of all the baptized. My prayer is that we would each open ourselves to the grace to accept humbly the truth about ourselves—both our weaknesses and God's delight in us—that will allow us to truly become who we really *are* in Christ, beloved sons or daughters of the Father. If we can truly acknowledge our need, and His delight to meet our need (interiorly) and to heal us, we will be able to live out our identity as Sons and Daughters of God and to serve, by our word and example, as Salt, Light, and Leaven in the world. Come, Holy Spirit!

#### A Spiritual Exercise

I know that many of us have a very hard time imagining what God thinks of them. It can be a very good exercise to spend time in prayer, asking the question: "Father, what do you think of me, how are you beholding me, viewing me, as your son or daughter?" God loves us. And anytime we pray, when we are open to God's promptings, we please our Heavenly Father. He is pleased when we meditate on his word. He is pleased when we come to Mass, when we seek his face at Holy Hours or in prayer with our families around the dinner table or in the living room. He is pleased with us whenever we resist temptations and seek to do his will. he is pleased with us when we repent from sinful actions, seeking reconciliation with him in the confessional. As a perfect Father, God loves us. God chose us to be his children, and we are able, by his grace, to please him, just as Jesus did. There are many ways the Lord stirs our hearts. What is surely the case is that he is

inviting all of us to grow always more in faith, hope, and love—in holiness. Let's strive individually and as a parish to please our Heavenly Father by every action we take this year. If we make that effort, we will grow in holiness and love, and we will live with no regrets. That's a great way to begin (and end) a year. Let's get started!

#### The Baptism of the Lord






