A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Bishops' November Letter on Racism

As we celebrate Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day on Monday, it seems a good time to mention the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) pastoral letter on Racism, and to recommend that people take time this month and February, which is Black History Month, to engage with this ongoing crisis in our culture and our Church. This summary is taken from the USCCB website:

Bishop Shelton J. Fabre, of Houma-Thibodaux, Chairman of U.S. Bishops' Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism and Chair of the Sub-committee on African American Affairs within the Cultural Diversity Committee, issued the following statement:

"The entire body of bishops felt the need to address the topic of racism, once again, after witnessing the deterioration of the public discourse, and episodes of violence and animosity with racial and xenophobic overtones, that have re-emerged in American society in the last few years. Pastoral letters from the full body of bishops are rare, few and far between. But at key moments in history the bishops have come together for important pronouncements, paying attention to a particular issue and with the intention of offering a Christian response, full of hope, to the problems of our time. This is such a time."

. The pastoral letter asks us to recall that we are all brothers and sisters, all equally made in the image of God. Because we all bear the image of God, racism is above all a moral and theological problem that manifests institutionally and systematically. Only a deep individual conversion of heart, which then multiplies, will compel change and reform in our institutions and society. It is imperative to confront racism's root causes and the injustice it produces. The love of God binds us together. This same love should overflow into our relationships with all people. The conversions needed to overcome racism require a deep encounter with the living God in the person of Christ who can heal all division.

Exodus 90

A few weeks ago, I mentioned that I would be encouraging men in the parish to consider Exodus 90 as a way to begin the year and prepare for Easter. Here's a summary of what the program entails:

<u>I) 90 Days:</u> The 90-day benchmark is not an arbitrary number; it is essential for freedom. That's the period it takes to re-learn the joy and satisfaction of self-mastery and freedom. Most men consider the 90-day period of purification a manly challenge, something that may have been missing in their lives for a long time. In addition, researchers have found that it takes about 90 days – the length of many rehabilitation models, including AA – for the brain to "reset" itself. Interestingly enough, people in recovery have known this saying forever "90 meetings in 90 days" because when the brain is engaged in a habit for 90 days it becomes easier to do

II) Prayer: Each man is to commit to a holy hour each day. Minimum: 20 minutes. Where possible this is to take place with the other brothers of the Exodus 90 fraternity. The ninety scriptures from the book of Exodus and the corresponding meditations and action items are meant to guide a man's prayer throughout the 90

days of Exodus. That said, the presence of our Lady in the Rosary is imperative.

<u>III) Asceticism:</u> cold-lukewarm/short showers; no alcohol; no desserts & sweets; no eating between meals; no soda or sweetened drinks; no television or movies (without permission of group); only music that lifts the soul to God; no televised sports (without permission of group); computer for work/school only; regular and intense exercise; group holy hour & meetings; no major material purchases (beyond toiletries, etc., without permission of group); and seven hours of sleep each night is essential.

IV) Fraternity: The Exodus 90 fraternity consists of 5-7 men and a spiritual director. These fraternities are flesh-and-blood fraternities; not online. We do not connect you with other men. Invite men from the parish, work, or neighborhood to make this journey with you. There's no better way to revive your Knights of Columbus chapter or your TMIY group as going through this spiritual exercise. And if you do not have a fraternity already, it's time to be a protagonist and form one. Men are isolated today, and your invitation could be life-changing to someone near you. Also, ask a priest, a man who has already made his Exodus, or another wise man to guide your fraternity. These fraternities are to meet 3 times/week for no more than 30 minutes. Minimum: 1 meeting/week. These meetings are an opportunity for the men to give a self-report for accountability, to receive encouragement from the brotherhood, and wisdom from the mentor.

Many of the men who are part of the Wednesday morning men's breakfast are committing to be part of Exodus 90 (though it's not required for all those who are part of the men's breakfasts), and I know that others who are not attending the Wednesday breakfasts are planning to do Exodus 90 as well. If you have a group of five to seven men whom you would want to join with as a member of your Fraternity for the 90 days, you can initiate the group on their website (exodus90.com) or by linking from our main webpage, and then send email invitations to your friends. If you initiate the group, you can then send invitations to others in your group. For the record, I will serve as the spiritual director for all the groups, and will participate in Exodus 90 myself. I will attend the Wednesday morning meetings, and will be available at other times as well. The program is free for the first eight days, after which you need to commit. The cost is \$9.99 per month for three months. If we begin this coming Monday, we will finish up in time to celebrate well the Easter Octave.

Wedding at Cana

Today, we recall the miracle that Jesus worked at Mary's behest at the Wedding at Cana. Mary (and Jesus) care for our needs. Indeed, weddings are a great cause for celebration, and Mary and Jesus delighted to allow the gathered family and friends to continue to enjoy the best of wines by God's grace.

St. Adrian of Canterbury: I had several reflections after praying for the intercession of this African born saint, who was sent to Canterbury, England and served as abbott of the monastery. His leadership skills made the monastery a vital center for learning in the 7th century.

1st Reflection - Before the internet, people were our primary sources of information, and books if you were lucky enough to have them. This form of learning happens through the skill of verbal reasoning or logic. Sadly, we are seeing a loss of social skills in young people, and it is a skill our staff intentionally works to develop within our stu-

2nd Reflection - Catholic monasteries were the centers of learning for countries. It was Catholic monasteries which developed the university model and the first colleges. 3rd Reflection - The independent study of Catholic monks is where the specialized sciences were developed into separate fields of study. Most of our modern specialized career tracks can be traced back to the monasteries and our Catholic Intellectual Tradition.
