A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

What a Catholic Schools Week!

The Lord poured on the snow and cold this past week, and we look forward to rescheduling some of the events that we had scheduled for last week. Let's keep all those who are struggling with the cold in our prayers.

God Gives Gifts!

Last week, I preached about God's ongoing healing power in our midst, and mentioned that the Lord gives all the baptized gifts, which the Lord longs for us to "joyfully use . . . for the building up the Kingdom of God and the salvation of souls," as we've been praying for years. One of you reminded me of these very encouraging words of Blessed John Henry Newman, which highlight the importance of each and every one of us. It's my desire that we would all know the power of his words:

We are all created to [God's] glory—we are created to do His will. I am created to do something or to be something for which no one else is created; I have a place in God's counsels, in God's world, which no one else has; whether I be rich or poor, despised or esteemed by man, God knows me and calls me by my name. God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission . . . Somehow I am necessary for His purposes, as necessary in my place as an Archangel in his . . . I have a part in this great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connexion between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place . . . if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling. (Blessed John Henry Newman)

You Have Gifts!

Not only does each of us has his/her place, and his/her mission. We are also each given gifts. This is how St. Paul puts it: *Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I do not want you to be uninformed.*

. . . there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are inspired by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills. (I Cor. 12:1-11)

The Spirit of the Lord Is Upon Me . . .

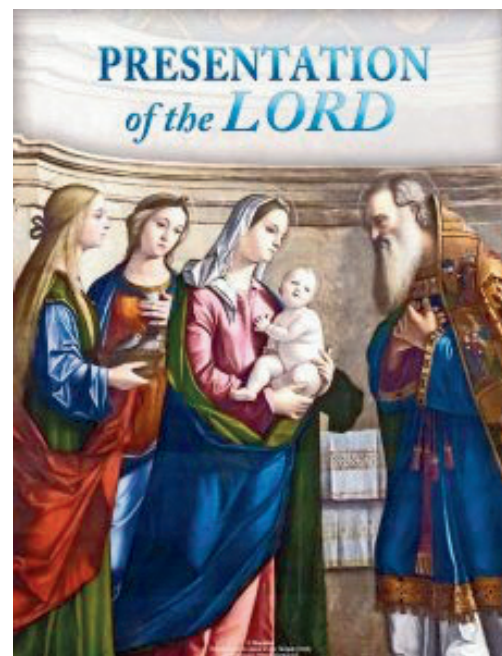
Last week, we heard the powerful account of Jesus's teaching in the synagogue. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

This week all across the country, we celebrated National Catholic Schools Week. We recognized the opportunity we have in this great country to freely worship God and to teach our children how to live in this world as Disciples of Christ. Quite often it is a freedom and privilege we take for granted, but the responsibility of handing down our faith is something we should never take lightly.

St. John Paul II says, *"to educate in the truth, and for genuine freedom and evangelical love, is at the very heart of the Church's mission. In a cultural climate in which moral norms are often thought to be matters of personal preference, Catholic schools have a crucial role to play in leading the younger generation to realize that freedom consists above all in being able to respond to the demands of the truth..."*

Catholic schools are on the frontlines of a battlefield we really can't see or even understand. We are fighting to uphold the truth, goodness and beauty of God's creation by teaching our children virtue and cultivating the academic skills needed to learn, both now and in the future. 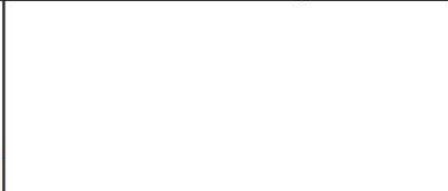
