A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Thank you!

As pastor of this parish and as a priest of the Diocese of Lansing, I want to thank those of you who have made a pledge to increase your giving here through the Generosity Challenge and/or have made a pledge to support the 2019 Diocesan Services Appeal. As I mentioned last week, I believe the Diocese of Lansing is acting as good stewards of the resources that they receive, and I am happy to make a pledge this year myself. If you have made a significant commitment to increase your Sunday offertory, and don't believe you can make a pledge to DSA, I understand. I would, however, invite everyone, even those of us who have made a pledge for increased offertory, to consider making a pledge to DSA, even if it is relatively small. Having a high percentage of our families make a pledge is a sign of our commitment to pray for and support the bishop and the work that he and his staff are helping us do throughout the diocese. If you have questions or concerns about giving to DSA, please contact me. I'd be happy to hear your concerns and answer any questions you might have.

Prayer to Remove Generational Spirits

This morning (Saturday, March 23rd), at the Mass for generational healing, among other things, we prayed together the following prayer, which is taken from *Deliverance Prayers: For Use by the Laity*, pp. 25-26, by Fr. Chad Ripperger. (Sensus Traditionis Press.) It is a powerful prayer, which would be worth praying with another person (see the underlined notes below).

Lord Jesus Christ, Incarnate Son of God the Father, Thou who hast chosen to enter into human history by being carried in the womb of Thy Blessed Mother Mary, grant, I beseech Thee, that any demons that may have been introduced into my generational line by any one of my ancestors may be blocked from passing to the subsequent generations. I ask Thee that if the evil spirit entered the generational line by the sin of one or more of my ancestors, that Thou wouldst pardon the temporal punishment due to their sin and free us from the demon's involvement in our lives.

Blessed Virgin, we ask thee to offer the Precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of thy Son to God the Father in reparation for the sins of those ancestors who may have introduced any evil spirits into my generational line as well as any subsequent sins that may have resulted from the evil spirits affecting those of the generational line. If any evil spirit has been introduced into my generational line as a result of a curse or malefice done by someone outside my family, I ask thee to give me the grace to forgive them wholeheartedly and I ask Thee Jesus to break the curse or malefice, if it is still in place. God the Father, I forgive them for any of the effects of their sin that they may have committed against my family line and for any damage it may have caused. Jesus, I ask Thee to forgive me of any sins that may be the result of any generational spirits in my family and I ask Thee to block any power the evil spirits may have gained in my generational line as a result of my own sin.

Heal any damage in the lives of the members of my family as a result of the generational spirit. I bind and completely and utterly reject, with the full force of my will any sin or spiritual defect of mine as well as any temptation, allurements or power that any generational spirit may have over me as a result of my sin or the sin of any other person. I do this in the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary and in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

It is highly recommended that one pray to Our Lady of Sorrows to ask Her to reveal what the nature of the generational spirit is and how they may have entered the generational line so that specific binding prayers may be said against them and virtues may be developed to combat them. It is also salutary to have Masses offered in reparation for any sin that may be the cause of the generational spirit as well as healing of the members who may still suffer the effects of the evil spirit and for the repose of any souls in Purgatory that may still be there as a result of sins they committed at the behest of the evil spirit.

Please make an appointment with me or with one of the other healing prayer teams, if you have particular concerns about your own family's background and/or would like to follow-up regarding healing prayer. You can do so on our webpage or by calling the parish office.

Prayer Ministry after 9:00 a.m. Mass

As a reminder, "conference style" prayer ministry, which means sessions of between five and ten minutes, is available most Sundays, including this Sunday, in Mercy Hall in the conference room on the east end of the building. There is a sign-up sheet outside the conference room door, which is just to the right of the restrooms. Many people have found even these brief sessions helpful. I'm grateful for the teams that make it possible for us to offer this ministry.

The Women's Evening of Adoration will be held Thursday, March 28th, from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m., concluding with Benediction. The men's evenings are held on the second Thursdays of every month.

Confession is Good (of course!) for the Soul

As a priest, I am grateful for the opportunity that the Lord has given me to serve the faithful in and through the sacrament of reconciliation. I am committed to offering confession often, and want to encourage everyone to take time this Lent to go to confession. Each Advent and Lent there is an opportunity for our city-wide communal penance services. They will be held next Sunday (March 31st) at 2:00 p.m. at St. Gerard and St. Thomas. As always, there will be a good number of priests at each church to hear your confession. If it's been a while since you were last at confession, don't rob yourself or those you love of the grace of forgiveness. The Lord allows us to begin again when we go to confession.

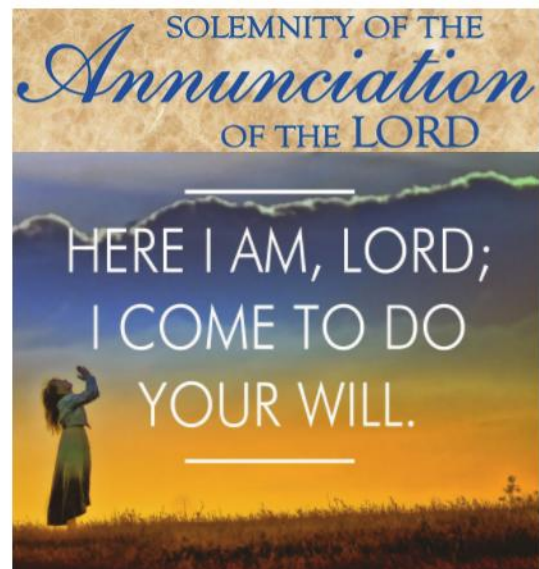
