A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

It's Pentecost. Come, Holy Spirit!

Today, we pray for the Holy Spirit to come . . . *fill the hearts of the faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love* . . . Just what we've been praying for years. As I've said more than a few times over the past years, "Come, Holy Spirit" is a prayer that the Holy Spirit can't resist. He comes! May we be those who open our hearts to receive with an open heart, mind, and will the power of the Holy Spirit.

"Surpassing Greatness of His Power . . ."

I said last week, Paul's letter to the Ephesians speaks this prayer of blessing. It's my prayer for myself and all of us: May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call, what are the riches of glory in his inheritance among the holy ones, and what is the surpassing greatness of his power for us who believe . . . For us! Each and every one of us.

God Is Love . . .

Last weekend, I preached about the importance of making a decision to believe in God's love for us, and to have a "personal relationship" with God the Father, and Jesus, our Lord, brother, and friend. Here is an excerpt from the beginning of Pope Benedict XVI's Encyclical, "God Is Love":

"God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him" (I Jn. 4:16). These words from the First Letter of John express with remarkable clarity the heart of the Christian faith: the Christian image of God and the resulting image of mankind and its destiny. In the same verse, Saint John also offers a kind of summary of the Christian life: "We have come to know and to believe in the love God has for us".

We have come to believe in God's love: in these words the Christian can express the fundamental decision of his life. Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction. Saint John's Gospel describes that event in these words: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should ... have eternal life" (3:16).

In acknowledging the centrality of love, Christian faith has retained the core of Israel's faith, while at the same time giving it new depth and breadth. The pious Jew prayed daily the words of the <u>Book of Deuteronomy</u> which expressed the heart of his existence: "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God is one Lord, and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your might" (6:4-5). Jesus united into a single precept this commandment of love for God and the commandment of love for neighbour found in the <u>Book of Leviticus</u>: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself" (19:18; cf. Mk 12:29-31). Since God has first loved us (cf. 1 Jn 4:10), love is now no longer a mere "command"; it is the response to the gift of love with which God draws near to us.

Come Encounter Jesus

This Saturday evening (June 8th), we will have a time of praise, worship, prayer, adoration, and confession from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. in the church. It's a great opportunity to worship God and to open our hearts to have Him do healing work in us. Come, and bring others with you. Prayer teams will be available to pray for healing and other requests. Come, and invite someone to join you.

Charismatic Mass (monthly on the Second Sunday at 1:30) Our next "Charismatic Mass" is this Sunday, June 9th at 1:30 p.m. You might wonder what it would be like. Basically, everything in the Mass will be the same as our 9:00 a.m. Mass, with two exceptions. First, we will take time for extended adoration and praise at the conclusion of the Gloria, during which those who are present are free to lift their hearts and their hands in prayer, and also, if they feel so moved, to pray "in the spirit" using prayer tongues. Second, there will also be an extended time of thanks, praise, and worship after communion.




