A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Summer is finally here!

As we enjoy summer, it is well, at this time of year, to remind everyone about the importance of dressing appropriately for Mass. Most especially on the weekends, shorts are not appropriate attire for worship. Ideally, we would never wear jeans either, in the summer or the rest of the year. Imagine that we are (for we ARE) coming into the presence of our Lord. What would we wear to meet Him and to receive Him “under our roof”? I’m confident that we would wear our “Sunday best” in order to honor Him. Let’s encourage each other, and dress modestly and appropriately this summer. This is especially true of those who are exercising various ministries at Mass. Thank you.

Charismatic Mass Update

A couple of months ago, we tried an experiment. We held a couple of “charismatic Masses.” Given low turnout, it doesn’t seem wise to add a fourth Mass on Sundays, even once a month. After some prayer and discussion, we’ve decided not to continue the charismatic Mass, which means there will not be a Mass next Sunday at 1:30. Please let those who have attended from other parishes that we’ve made this change. I want to thank C.J. & Brenda DeFord and Christopher and Linda Luea for their music ministry at the two Masses we had here, and I hope that they will become part of the 9:00 a.m. ministry team when opportunity permits. We are looking to offer opportunities on occasion for charismatic worship, including the exercise of charismatic gifts. We hope to do so at the end of our “Resurrection Life” course, which we will run in the fall. Stay tuned for updates.

Men’s Evening of Adoration

Our monthly Men’s Evening of Adoration will be held this Thursday from 7-8 p.m. in the church, with fellowship following. In future months, because we will be offering Resurrection Life talks and other formation sessions on Thursday evenings, the Men’s and Women’s evenings of adoration will be shifted to Fridays, again from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m., so that I can be in attendance and help teach those courses. Thanks for understanding!

Prayers for Vocations

Today, Jesus tells us this: “The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.” There’s no doubt that we have great need for laborers for the harvest. All of us are called to be “co-laborers” in the vineyard of the Lord, but we definitely are called to raise up boys and men who are open to the great gift to be a priest. I am now in my fifteenth year, and am more excited about my priestly ministry than ever before. Families, thank you for your openness to life. Can I encourage you to pray that your sons and daughters would pray for discernment about their vocation. Encourage your sons to contemplate the priesthood or religious life, and your daughters to prayerfully contemplate a call to the religious life. If God is calling them, they will be happiest if they say yes. I was late in saying “yes,” but so grateful that the Lord deigned to invite me to become a priest of Jesus Christ. That gift, and the grace of being the pastor here, give me great joy. Here’s a reminder of what the patron of diocesan priests, St. John Vianney, in his *Catechism on the Priesthood*, says about the priesthood:

Saint Bernard tells us that everything has come to us through Mary; and we may also say that everything has come to us through the priest; yes, all happiness, all graces, all heavenly gifts. If we had not the Sacrament of Orders, we should not have Our Lord. Who placed Him there, in that tabernacle? It was the priest. Who was it that received your soul, on its entrance into life? The priest. Who nourishes it, to give it strength to make its pilgrimage? The priest. Who will prepare it to appear before God, by washing that soul, for the last time, in the blood of Jesus Christ? The priest -- always the priest. And if that soul comes to the point of death, who will raise it up, who will restore it to calmness and peace? Again the priest. You cannot recall one single blessing from God without finding, side by side with this recollection, the image of the priest.

These beautiful words from St. John Vianney remind me of the great dignity of the priesthood, and humble me that the Lord has called me to this great honor and service to you. May we be a parish that fosters vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Come, Holy Spirit!

Opportunities to Spend Time with Jesus

As Pastor, I’m grateful for the opportunities we have for daily Mass, as well as times of adoration on Tuesday evenings and Fridays. In these ways, the faithful can spend quiet prayerful time with Jesus. In the quiet of the Church, we are invited to enter into His rest, as we pour out our hearts to Him and receive consolations in the Spirit. Most of us live lives of hectic busyness, and the Lord longs for us to “come away by ourselves” for prayer and rest on a regular basis. Jesus modeled this “retreating” from the busyness of the world. By following His example, we can be strengthened for the daily work of being a disciple. Spending time in prayer is never wasted time. Let’s commit ourselves to praying more and more. I sense the Lord saying to me (and to you): “Don’t just do something. *Sit there!*”
