CHILDREN'S SCHOLA

We have been so remarkably blessed at Church of the Resurrection to have so many musicians who make devoted efforts to beautify our liturgies. Our parish and school have been exposed to many genres of music, ranging from rich choral music, Taize, hymns and contemporary songs, as well as drawing from the deep well that is Gregorian chant and polyphony.

Inspired by our parish values of seeking to support families in forming their children and build up what is 'authentically Catholic' (and because there is no more authentically Catholic music than chant) this fall a Children's Schola is being developed under the co-direction of Guine Christian and Lori Weismantel with help from Marisol Hennig. After consulting with Father Steve and members of parish leadership, we decided that the best place to start would be a weekly class with a small group of no more than 12 children from grades 3-5. This small group of young singers will be learning foundational principles for chant, as well as vocal techniques, musical theory, and the Church's repertory of music along with smatterings of chant terminology and Church history along the way in addition to their regular music classes at school. Beginning in Advent, they will help to lead the Communion Chant at our Wednesday school liturgies, as well as prepare all the music for May Crowning in the Spring. We hope not only to boost the students' musical skills and develop their appreciation for chant, but also to deepen their prayerful participation in Mass.

Our decision to start with personal invitations to a small number of students is because we are volunteers who've never led a children's schola before. We need some time to find our footing, so please bear with us as things develop. All the students at Resurrection School (and any homeschool families attending our Wednesday morning Mass) will still be gaining exposure to chant throughout this academic year, and we are very hopeful that this little apostolate flourish and grow to include more children in time.


