A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Praying for You and Your Intentions

This past Wednesday, I left with some parishioners on a Pilgrimage to Fatima, Lourdes, and Spain. Fr. John Fain and Fr. Mark Rutherford are also on the pilgrimage. Please pray for us as we travel, that we will have a deep encounter with the Lord and to gain new insights into the land where Jesus was born, lived, and died for love of us. We will be celebrating Mass at many holy places, and I invite you to send me your intentions either by email, in the offertory, or at the office. I will bring those with me and remember all of you and your intentions every day as we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Amazon Synod

Among the intentions that I am praying for on my pilgrimage is the upcoming Synod, which is entitled "New Paths for the Church and for an Integral Ecology." The Oct. 6-27 synod will draw some 300 Catholic leaders from the Pan-Amazonian region to discuss issues including the rights of indigenous populations, land rights, migration, corruption, the Church's missionary efforts in the area, local liturgy and sustainable development. My concerns echo those of many Church leaders who see in the preparatory document real dangers of openness to pagan/ pantheist/animist beliefs by what I consider an unhealthy openness to indigenous religions. Those concerns are even greater for me than the contemplation of changing the discipline concerning celibacy. Please do fast and pray that the Church would retain her commitment to the Truth that has been handed down to us. The ultimate danger, in my estimation, is a confusion about whether we ought to follow the Spirit of God or the Spirit of the Age. It is no hyperbole to say that this Synod, with it's very problematic preparatory working document, is the most important Synod among all those called since Vatican II. Please pray and fast about this. May the Synod members seek always only to please the Lord. Come, Holy Spirit!

Resurrection Life Course

Whether you are just beginning your journey of faith or have been living your faith for decades, I want to invite you to prayerfully consider attending (and bringing others with you to attend) the upcoming Resurrection Life Course. The format of Resurrection Life will be like Alpha.

We will begin with a meal, have a live talk about what difference God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, make in our lives. We will then have discussion groups to discuss the talk. There will be a book that includes daily short readings, and we will have opportunities for prayer and healing throughout the course. We are offering child-care to make it possible for young couples to attend. You can find out more information on our website, and you can register by calling the office, filling out one of the green registration forms, or you can register online. We hope to have a good response to this course, and invite you, again, to prayerfully consider attending yourself and bringing others along as well. The evenings will begin a 6:30 with dinner, and we will wrap-up each evening by 8:30.


Year of Prayer Forming Missionary Disciples




