#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

#### **Resurrection Life Course**

Whether you are just beginning your journey of faith or have been living your faith for decades, I want to invite you to prayerfully consider attending (and bringing others with you to attend) the upcoming Resurrection Life Course. We are offering child-care to make it possible for young couples to attend. You can find out more information on our website, and you can register by calling the office, filling out one of the green registration forms, or you can register online. The evenings will begin at 6:30 with dinner, and we will wrap-up each evening at 8:30.

#### **Five Precepts of the Church**

At two of the Masses last weekend, I went through the Five Precepts of the Church, in light of the Gospel about "doing what we are commanded." Here they are in brief. You can read more in the Catechism, beginning at paragraph 2041.

2042 The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days. (1389, 2180, 1457, 1389) The second precept ("You shall confess your sins at least once a year.") ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness. The third precept ("You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

2043 The fourth precept ("You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church") ensures the times of ascesis and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart. (2177, 1387, 1438, 1351) The fifth precept ("You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church") means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability. The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to his abilities. III. Moral Life and Missionary Witness 2044 The fidelity of the baptized is a primordial condition for the proclamation of the Gospel and for the Church's mission in the world. In order that the message of salvation can show the power of its truth and radiance before men, it must be authenticated by the witness of the life of Christians. "The witness of a Christian life and good works done in a supernatural spirit have great power to draw men to the faith and to God." (852, 905)

2045 Because they are members of the Body whose Head is Christ, Christians contribute to building up the Church by the constancy of their convictions and their moral lives. The Church increases, grows, and develops through the holiness of her faithful, until "we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ." (753, 828)

#### "Wokeness," "Identity Politics," and "Social Justice"

Some of you were puzzled by my comments at the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Masses about the rise of what some commentators have called a new civil religion. Before I continue, I want to say clearly that the Church is clear about the realities of imbalance of power in society, and she offers remedies based in the Social Teaching of the Catholic Church and our common human dignity. "Wokeness," on the other hand, is the belief that there are fundamentally unjust power structures in society, and that society must change the power relations for justice to be attained. Wokeness, identity politics, and social justice activism depend upon uncovering "systematically unjust structures of power" that keep some groups down and others in power. This new "religion" has roots in Critical Theory (which draws on Marxist materialist philosophy), and is increasingly evident in universities, business, public schools, and the broader culture. It is fast (in fact, very fast) becoming the "religion" of the elites. Daily we see and hear from "ministers/preachers" of this new religion who articulate politically correct and incorrect beliefs. As one example of a "heresy" of this new "religion," consider how quickly a previously "obvious" belief, namely, that marriage should be restricted to one man and one woman, has today become "hateful" or "bigoted." In other words, the old belief is now "heretical" among cultural/political elites today. The ideological press of "wokeness" is steadily growing in business, in the university, and our public schools. For those who want more background on this important array of issues, I have inserted links on our website in the commentary on the homily from last weekend. I would also be happy to speak with you about it. Let us please pray for wisdom as we address real concerns with the insights we have from our Lord and our Church.

#### Pray and Fast for the Holy Father and the Synod

As I mentioned last weekend, right now the important "Pan Amazonian Synod" is ongoing, and the preparatory document has sparked not a little controversy for its proposal to allow untrained married (viri probati) "proven" men to be ordained. More problematic in my view is the curious openness to the native, pagan beliefs of the people of the Amazon, complete with "mother earth" worship, shamanism, etc. The Holy Father has said that the Holy Spirit is in charge of the Synod, and I pray indeed that the Holy Spirit and not the Spirit of the Age is guiding the work of the Synod Fathers. In any case, all we can do is fast and pray. Come, Holy Spirit!






