A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Update on Witness to Hope

Thanks to all of you who have been giving generously these past couple of years to the Witness to Hope campaign for the Broader Church and our two main projects, the sanctuary renovation and building a connection (and handicap accessibility) for our school. Giving is coming along well. We had, you may recall, estimated that the cost of the sanctuary renovation would be approximately \$750,000, and the project to connect the two school buildings approximately \$1,200,000. After we ran the campaign, we met a different architect who gave us several versions of renovation, the last of which was approved by Bishop Boyea and the Liturgical Design Committee of the diocese early this year. We have been in ongoing conversations with Tom Rajkovich, the architect with whom we have been working, and he is currently working on detailed drawings for a key portion of the design, which we will use to get a sample of a lower-cost installation. We are seeking to be the best stewards of the resources we have been given, and, if we can save on the construction (and the quality is as good), our \$750,000 estimate will be closer to the total we are likely to have to expend. If not, our total will likely be closer to \$1,000,000 or so. Stay tuned for the results of the demonstration of this alternative process, and the final estimate for the sanctuary.

Annual Report

Speaking of money, I want to apologize that we have not yet published our 2018-2019 Annual Report. Don Radke, our Business Manager, and I will be meeting with the Finance Council this week, and we will publish the annual report next weekend. My busy fall has made meeting and finalizing things more difficult. We will announce a time and place for meeting to review it in the bulletin next weekend.

2020 GUIDELINES FOR SCHEDULING MASS INTEN-TIONS

POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Mass stipends are \$10 and are to be paid when requesting Masses. Payable by check or exact change only.
- Limit of 6 Masses per parish family may be requested for the year, (up to 2 of these can be for the Sunday obligation)
- Only 1 intention per Mass is allowed, per Canon Law. However, to better accommodate the needs of our parishioners, we can list up to 2 first names with the same last name (i.e. John & Mary Smith) OR 2 last names (i.e. Jones & Smith Families)
- No Mass will be permanently affixed in the Mass Book until the stipend is received.
 - The first stipend received is assigned the date.

SPECIAL NOTES TO REMEMBER

- One Sunday Mass per weekend is offered for the intention of the Parishioners of Resurrection
- Have an alternate date/time in mind
- Please note that scheduled Masses may need to be moved to another date/time due to the availability of our priest.
- All Mass intentions over 6 requests will be sent to a Mission assigned by the Diocese.




ST. JOSEPH CATHOLIC CEMETERY
