A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Prayers for Church Leaders

Please pray for the final push of the Pan-Amazonian Synod, that the Synod Fathers will have wisdom from the Holy Spirit and stand strong in resisting the Spirit of the Age. Most especially, please offer prayers for the Holy Father, as he drafts the Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation that will follow the Synod. As many of you already know, there are reasons for concern based on what has been promoted during the Synod. Most problematic for me, in light of the Church's teaching is the seeming openness to false religions. The Church is clear that Jesus is the only source of salvation (and the ultimate self-revelation of God). Sadly, the Synod has featured presentations and activities that reflect an openness to indigenous religious rites and symbols, which many, including me, consider dangerously close to (if not in fact) violations of the First Commandment: *I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself a graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them.*

Other proposals that have garnered a lot of media attention include the potential ordination of *virī probati*, "proven" married men, as priests, and giving women an official liturgical ministry, such as lector or acolyte. Some have even hinted that the final draft report will include a proposal to ordain women to the permanent diaconate. St. John Paul II, whose Feast Day we celebrated on October 22nd, settled the matter regarding women's ordination, when he wrote the following in the conclusion of his Apostolic Letter *Ordinatio Sacerdotalis*:

4. Although the teaching that priestly ordination is to be reserved to men alone has been preserved by the constant and universal Tradition of the Church and firmly taught by the Magisterium in its more recent documents, at the present time in some places it is nonetheless considered still open to debate, or the Church's judgment that women are not to be admitted to ordination is considered to have a merely disciplinary force.

Wherefore, in order that all doubt may be removed regarding a matter of great importance, a matter which pertains to the Church's divine constitution itself, in virtue of my ministry of confirming the brethren (cf. Lk 22:32) I declare that the Church has no authority whatsoever to confer priestly ordination on women and that this judgment is to be definitively held by all the Church's faithful.

Without doubt, women are vital for the life of the Church, but proposals to allow women into the clerical state would create a rupture in the unchanging Tradition of the Church, and must be rejected, which was made clear by the definitive statement of Pope St. John Paul II.

St. John Henry Newman, Pray for Us!

On October 13th, along with four other women, John Henry Newman was declared a Saint. Bishop Bob Barron considers St. John Henry Newman the greatest Catholic theologian since St. Thomas Aquinas. Among his many

great works, St. John Henry Newman's *Essay on the Development of Christian Doctrine* is very helpful today, as many in the Church are contemplating many "innovations," such as those I've outlined above. St. John Henry Newman would tell us to look at any proposed change in light of what he calls "seven notes" of a "genuine development of Christian doctrine" as contrasted with a "corruption." The seven notes are the following: 1) preservation of type, 2) continuity of principles, 3) power of assimilation, 4) logical sequence, 5) anticipation of its future, 6) conservation of the past, and 7) chronic vigor. His point is that genuine developments never radically change what has gone before, but are always in natural (and supernatural) continuity with what has gone before. In light of proposals at the Synod that seem to call for radical change, I find Newman's short description of the seventh note very helpful: *We have arrived at length at the seventh and last test, which was laid down when we started, for distinguishing the true development of an idea from its corruptions and perversions: it is this. A corruption, if vigorous, is of brief duration, runs itself out quickly, and ends in death; on the other hand, if it lasts, it fails in vigour and passes into a decay. This general law gives us additional assistance in determining the character of the developments of Christianity commonly called Catholic. In other words, even if what he would consider corruptions are approved by the Synod, his reading of history tells him that they will not last. And, if they do last, they will eventually die out, because the Lord's promise holds: "I have yet many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. 13 When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come" (John 16:12-13). This promise is not made to me or to you, but the Church as a whole. Come, Holy Spirit, guide us into all truth!*
