

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Fifteenth Annual Resurrection School Auction

Next Saturday evening, November 9th, after the Vigil Mass, we will gather to celebrate God's goodness to us and to have an evening of fun, fellowship, and fundraising at our 15th Annual School Auction. I'm grateful for all of those who have labored lovingly to prepare for that annual event. In contrast to many school auctions, the cost is minimal to attend. We want this to be a parish event as well as a way to help us raise money to continue to form Disciples of Christ at Resurrection School. Please plan to join us after the Saturday evening Mass on the 9th of November. It's a great time and a great cause.

Annual Report

We will review the Annual Report (copies of which are available at the parish office and in the vestibule of the church) and answer questions on Sunday, November 10th at 12:30 p.m. in the St. John Paul II Room, (123 Rumsey, the boiler building).

Realigning Resources for Mission Committee

As I have mentioned several times before, I am one of fourteen individuals (including priests, deacons, diocesan staff, and lay men and women) who have been asked by the bishop to prayerfully and reflectively discern several alternative proposals to present to the bishop (after consultation with clergy and lay faithful) for the best way to utilize current resources (physical, human, and financial) in order to help our parishes more effectively become fruitful communities of missionary disciples. There are several other initiatives at the diocesan level that I will talk about after Advent. It is clear to the bishop and all of us that we will need to find ways to better allocate priest resources, especially in terms of sacramental life. One inevitable (though as yet undetermined) result will be the elimination of some Masses, to avoid overburdening priests and to encourage better stewardship of human and material resources.

How This Will Affect Us

It is not clear at this point just how the work of this committee will affect the Church of the Resurrection, but it will eventually affect all parishes and parishioners throughout the diocese. This committee work has caused me to prayerfully consider how Mass times are set here at the parish. As many of you know, when I was named pastor in 2012, Fr. Mark Rutherford helped me with sacramental life, and, after he left, Fr. Ken Coughlin was here for seven months or so, ending in June of 2015. Since then, I have (with occasional help from other priests) been responsible for all the sacramental life of the parish. I am happy to do so, but I have recently realized that the regular practice of having me celebrate four weekend (Sunday) Masses is one more than the Church typically allows. With the pending work of the committee, it will eventually need to change.

Saturday Evening Mass

Every October, along with every other parish in the diocese, we took a count of all those who attended each Mass. Our total this year was 885, one less than last year's total of 886. I suspect that most other parishes will have seen at least a small decline, so I am pleased by that number. The average attendance for each Mass for the month was as follows: Saturday 5:00 p.m., 143; Sunday 9:00 a.m., 331; Sunday 11:00 a.m., 238; and Sunday 5:30 p.m., 173. Given these numbers and knowing that we will eventually need to eliminate one Mass, after consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council, effective the first Saturday of 2020 (January 4), we will no longer have a Saturday evening Mass. That same weekend we will also change the Mass time for Sunday evening to 5:00 p.m., to accommodate those who prefer the earlier Mass time. Should anyone need to attend Mass on Saturday evening (because of work schedule or other reasons), every other parish in the community offers a Saturday evening Mass. Given the higher numbers at the 5:30 p.m. Mass and that Resurrection is one of only four area parishes with a Sunday evening Mass, it seemed to me and the Parish Pastoral Council that it was wisest to retain the Sunday evening Mass. I know that this will take some adjustment on the part of those who typically attend the Saturday evening Mass, but I hope that the two months' notice will be a help in making that adjustment. It will also hopefully allow all of us to enter more deeply into the Lord's Day as a day of prayer and rest and refreshment. If you have concerns or questions about these changes, please let me know.

Saturday Evenings & Sundays

Another change that we will implement on January 4, 2020 is shifting Vespers from Sunday evening at 7:00 p.m. to Saturday evening at 5:30 p.m. This change will also allow us to change the monthly (First Sunday) Extraordinary Form Compline to 7:00 p.m. This will allow young families to bring their children to experience that beautiful evening of prayer. On the first Saturday of the month, we will hold Solemn Vespers, which would include a brief homily after the reading, and incensation during the singing of the *Magnificat*.


