A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

December 7th Evening of Renewal/Prayer Meeting (POSTPONED)

The "Evening of Renewal" originally scheduled for 7:00 p.m. tonight (Saturday, December 7th) has been postponed until after the New Year. Given the busyness of the season, we thought better to postpone this to January. Sorry for the late notice.

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

We normally celebrate our nation's Patronal Feast Day on December 8, but because this year the 8th fell on the Second Sunday of Advent, that takes precedent. Because of the importance of the Immaculate Conception, the Feast Day has been moved to Monday this year. Though it is not a Holy Day of Obligation, we will offer three Masses to make it possible for everyone who wishes to come celebrate and honor our Blessed Mother at 8:15, Noon, and 6:30 p.m.

Special Rorate Masses December 11th & 14th at 7:00 a.m.

Wednesday and Saturday mornings at 7:00 a.m., we will celebrate special Rorate Masses by candlelight in addition to our normal 8:15 a.m. Mass. The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. The interplay of light and darkness speak to the meaning of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world.

The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8: "Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem." "Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour." The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honor, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ. The readings and prayers of the Mass foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel, and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord.

Come Encounter Jesus

Next Saturday, December 14th, we will have our next Healing Encounter. It is a time of praise, worship, prayer, and adoration from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. in the church. It's a great opportunity to worship God and to open our hearts to have Him do healing work in us. Come, and bring others with you. Prayer teams will be available to pray for healing and other requests. Come, and invite someone to join you.

Communal Penance Service/Confessions

This week in the Gospel, we are reminded that St. John the Baptist called those who heard him to repentance, which was a way to prepare their hearts to receive Jesus and the Holy Spirit He came to give us. Let us all see this holy season as an invitation from the Lord to prepare a way of the Lord in our own hearts. One way to prepare a way is to make a good confession. Next Sunday (12/15) afternoon at 2:00 p.m. at St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Gerard, there will be our Advent Community Communal Penance Service. If this afternoon is not a good time for you, consider making a good confession during one of the

opportunities we have regularly here at the Church of the Resurrection for the sacrament of reconciliation. See the bulletin for confession times.

Robert Cardinal Sarah's The Day Is Now Far Spent

Last weekend, at the Sunday Masses, I referenced (and quoted from) Cardinal Sarah's most recent book, The Day Is Now Far Spent, which takes the form of a dialogue with Nicolas Diat. Here are some quotes from Chapter 18, entitled "What Must We Do?"

NICOLAS DIAT: Your diagnosis seems very somber. Are you not lacking in hope?

ROBERT CARDINAL SARAH: Hope is not a smug optimism! Since a believer's hope has it source in God, one can truly hope only insofar as one has ties with God and is open to his influence. Hope is a constant combat. In this combat, the only weapons we wield are prayer, silence, the Word of God, and faith. We need an uprising of men and women who have the courage and spiritual energy to speak and to act, thus sowing around them the seed of good sense, truth, love, and peace. Yes! Hope is a difficult combat. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that it is "the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit" (CCC 1817). This virtue strengthens our trust. We have no doubt, Jesus told us: "I have conquered the world." He is the victor. Christians are peaceful and confident because they know that Christ has already conquered. What reassures us is not our own effort or our power. The Church must remain peaceful and serene when facing the coalition of powers that forms to put her to scorn. Our hope is founded on the limitless goodness of God. Christian hope is calming and demanding. Benedict XVI declared in October 2011:

St. John Chrysostom, in one of his homilies, comments: "For so long as we are sheep, we conquer: though ten thousand wolves prowl around, we overcome and prevail. But if we become wolves, we are worsted, for the help of our Shepherd departs from us" (Homily 33, 1: PG 57, 389). Christians must never yield to the temptation to become wolves among wolves; it is not with might, with force, with violence that Christ's kingdom of peace grows, but with the gift of self, with love carried to the extreme, even towards enemies.

Hope enables us to be perfectly lucid in our diagnosis. I rejoice in these trying times for the witness and words of Cardinal Sarah. He offers a pattern and challenge for me, my brother priests, and for all the faithful, to take up the "only weapons we wield," which he tells us, "are prayer, silence, the Word of God, and faith." That seems just about right to me. Let's spend time this Advent in prayer, enjoying a bit of silence, reading the Word of God, and growing in the knowledge and practice of our faith. Amen!


