

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Welcome!

At this joyful time of year, many people feel drawn to church. It is the Lord's love drawing us to the vulnerable Baby Jesus, who came among us as a sign of God's humility and love for us. If you're visiting or it has been a long time since you have been here, we're glad you're here! For whatever reason you came, thanks for joining us. We want you to feel welcome, and we very much desire to support you (and your family) in any ways we can. Fill out a visitor's card, which you can find in the pew. We are honored to have you with us.

Why We're Here . . .

The Church of the Resurrection is committed to spreading the Good News in word and deed, to living our faith in authentic ways, and supporting families (i.e., helping each other and our family members get to heaven). Mission-Focused, Authentically Catholic, and Supportive of Families are our parish "Core Values." Those values inform and shape our life and ministry as a parish, school, and community.

Christmas & New Year's Mass Schedule

This week, we celebrate Christ's birth. On Christmas Eve, we will have Masses at 4:30 and Midnight (prelude music will commence at 11:30 p.m.). On Christmas Day, there will be one Mass at 10:00 a.m. Next Sunday, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Holy Family. After that, on the Eighth Day (the Octave) of Christmas, which is January 1, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. We will have a Vigil Mass at 4:30 p.m. December 31 as well Mass during the night at 10:30 p.m., followed by adoration and Benediction just prior to Midnight. New Year's Day we will have one Mass at 10:00 a.m. If those times won't work for you, please check with surrounding parishes to begin the new year well, by praising our Lord. Please note that our offices will be closed on December 24 beginning at noon through the end of the week. Offices will be closed next week from noon on December 31st through the end of the day on January 1st. The parish office will be open the 2nd and 3rd next week. If you are traveling, may you enjoy the protection of your guardian angels, and have a joyous celebration with your family and friends. God bless you all.

Liturgical Changes Coming in the New Year Every October, along with every other parish in the diocese, we took a count of all those who attended each Mass. Our total this year was 885, one less than last year's total of 886.

The average attendance for each Mass for the month was as follows: Saturday 5:00 p.m., 143; Sunday 9:00 a.m., 331; Sunday 11:00 a.m., 238; and Sunday 5:30 p.m., 173. Given these numbers and knowing that we will eventually need to eliminate one Mass, after consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council, effective the first Saturday of 2020 (January 4), we will no longer have a Saturday evening Mass. That same weekend we will also change the Mass time for Sunday evening to 5:00 p.m., to accommodate those who prefer the earlier Mass time. Should anyone need to attend Mass on Saturday evening (because of work schedule or other reasons), every other parish in the community offers a Saturday evening Mass. Given the higher numbers at the 5:30 p.m. Mass and because our parish is one of only four Lansing area parishes with a Sunday evening Mass, it seemed to me and the Parish Pastoral Council that it was wisest to retain the Sunday evening Mass. I know that this will take some adjustment on the part of those who typically attend the Saturday evening Mass, but I hope that the two months' notice will be a help in making that adjustment. It will also hopefully allow all of us to enter more deeply into the Lord's Day as a day of prayer and rest and refreshment.

Merry Christmas!

May you and those you love experience the joy and peace of this holy season, and know the love of God made flesh in the person of the Baby Jesus. When you come to Mass on Christmas and throughout the Octave of Christmas, copies of four books will be available. The first is *Letter to a Suffering Church, by Bishop* Robert Barron. Two other books that we're offering are: Joy to the World by Dr. Scott Hahn and Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary by Brant Pitre. This coming year, I pray we will all grow in our knowledge and practice of the faith. For families in our parish, we have a book by Patrick Lencioni entitled The 3 Big *Questions for a Frantic Family. These books have* already been distributed to school and pre-school families. Please leave the copies of this book for families in the parish who are not part of the school or pre-school. The Lencioni books were much more expensive than the ones we typically hand out, so we were not able to purchase as many. Please pray for all who will attend Mass here at Christmas, that we will all grow in wisdom and knowledge and virtue in the New Year. May all of us and those we love have a joyful celebration of the Savior's Birth.

Formation Course: "The Journey to God"

The Church of the Resurrection Formation Program consists of fifteen three-talk courses which are covered over four years. The courses are divided into two categories: Love of God and Love of Neighbor.

With these courses we aim to encourage our parishioners to enter more deeply into the love that God has called us to through a life of prayer, self-denial and regular participation in the sacraments, and to share that love with others through service and the exercise of the virtues in our families and with all those we meet, including those who have not yet encountered the life-transforming love of Christ.

The courses plumb the richness and beauty of Scripture, the teachings of the Catholic and the example and wisdom of the saints, and provide practical ways in which we can advance in obedience to the two greatest commandments: to love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

We will be running the first formation course in January 2020 entitled, "The Journey to God." The course follows the path that someone would take from initial conversion to sainthood and describes the different stages on that journey into the Heart of Love and into the fulfillment of all desire. Drawing upon the teaching of seven Spiritual Doctors of the Church, Ralph Martin presents a study of the journey to God. This course provides encouragement and direction for the pilgrim who desires to know, love, and serve our Lord.

Talk 1: "The Purgative Way" | January 16, 2020, 7-8:30pm in the Church

Talk 2: "The Illuminative Way" | January 23, 2020, 7-8:30pm in the Church

Talk 3: "The Unitive Way" | **January 30, 2020, 7-8:30pm in the Church**




