## A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

#### The Epiphany of the Lord

Today, we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, which means "to manifest" or "to show". We remember the visitation by the Magi (Three Wise Men) from the East who came to adore the Newborn King of the Jews. In Christ, God draws all nations into His family.

#### **Epiphany Home Blessing**

This year, I am going to invite you to use Holy Water that you have (or you can refill it at church) for this blessing. You can find chalk at the various exits for you to use in your homes to bless them.

This ceremony of the blessing of the home and inscription of the initials of the three Magi above each door can be performed either by a priest or the father/ head of the family. This is from the book <u>The Twelve</u> <u>Days of Christmas</u> by Elsa Chaney. The feast of manifestation, or Epiphany, is traditionally celebrated the 12th day after Christmas, January 6th. This year, the Church celebrates on the actual day of Epiphany. Prayer:

On entering the home,

Leader (*Father/head of the family*): Peace be to this house.

All: And to all who dwell herein.

All: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial. All Pray: The *Magnificat (During the Magnificat, the* 

room is sprinkled with holy water.)

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior

for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name.

*He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation.* 

He has shown the strength of his arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit.

He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly.

He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty.

He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children for ever. All: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial. Leader: Our Father. . . And lead us not into temptation

All: But deliver us from evil.

Leader: All they from Saba shall come

#### All: Bringing gold and frankincense.

Leader: O Lord, hear my prayer.

#### All: And let my cry come to You.

Leader: Let us pray. O God, who by the guidance of a star didst on this day manifest Thine only-begotten Son to the Gentiles, mercifully grant that we who know Thee by faith may also attain the vision of Thy glorious majesty. Through Christ our Lord. **All: Amen.** 

Leader: Be enlightened, be enlightened, O Jerusalem, for thy light is come, and the glory of the Lord is risen upon thee—Jesus Christ born of the Virgin Mary. **All: And the Gentiles shall walk in thy light and kings in the splendor of thy rising, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon thee.** 

Leader: Let us pray. Bless, O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who dwell herein. Through Christ our Lord.

#### All: Amen.

After the prayers of the blessing are recited, each room of the home is sprinkled with Epiphany water. The initials of the Magi are inscribed above the main entrance with the blessed chalk. (The initials of the three magi, C for Caspar, M for Melchior, B for Balthasar, can also be interpreted as the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "Christ bless this house".) Example: 20 + C + M + B + 20(The "20" and "20" indicate 2020.)

#### Liturgical Changes Coming in the New Year

Reminder: Effective this Saturday (January 4), we will no longer have a Saturday evening Mass. That weekend we will also change the Mass time for Sunday evening to 5:00 p.m., to accommodate those who prefer the earlier Mass time.

#### **Vespers and Compline Changes**


On First Saturdays, like this one, we will celebrate Vespers on Saturday at 6:30 p.m. It will be chanted Vespers, using the *Mundelein Psalter*. Sunday evening Vespers will be sung at 6:30 p.m. every week. Every First Sunday (like this one) Extraordinary Form Compline (Solemn Night Prayer) will be sung at 7:00 p.m. (Note the time change from 8:00 p.m.)

# Formation Course: "The Journey to God"

The Church of the Resurrection Formation Program consists of fifteen three-talk courses which are covered over four years. The courses are divided into two categories: Love of God and Love of Neighbor.

With these courses we aim to encourage our parishioners to enter more deeply into the love that God has called us to through a life of prayer, self-denial and regular participation in the sacraments, and to share that love with others through service and the exercise of the virtues in our families and with all those we meet, including those who have not yet encountered the life-transforming love of Christ.

The courses plumb the richness and beauty of Scripture, the teachings of the Catholic and the example and wisdom of the saints, and provide practical ways in which we can advance in obedience to the two greatest commandments: to love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

We will be running the first formation course in January 2020 entitled, "The Journey to God." The course follows the path that someone would take from initial conversion to



sainthood and describes the different stages on that journey into the Heart of Love and into the fulfillment of all desire. Drawing upon the teaching of seven Spiritual Doctors of the Church, Ralph Martin presents a study of the journey to God. This course provides encouragement and direction for the pilgrim

who desires to know, love, and serve our Lord.

Talk 2: "The Illuminative Way" | January 23, 2020, 7-8:30pm in the Church


Talk 3: "The Unitive Way" | January 30, 2020, 7-8:30pm in the Church


