A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Lord, Heal Our Land!

This Monday, as our nation takes a day to honor Martin Luther King, Jr., let us pray for continued healing of the wounds of racism in our nation, state, and community. The Lord invites us to love one another, and the historical and cultural divides are ones the evil one longs to exploit. May we be men and women who speak and act for the promotion of equity and justice in our Land. A recent film that would be very much worth viewing in this context is the much-heralded 2019 film "Just Mercy," which places a spotlight on a case of unjust treatment of an African-American suspect and those who fought to defend him.

Catholicism 101

I'm very grateful to be able to announce that beginning February 2, Brian Fink, our Middle School Religion & History teacher and a member of the parish formation team, will be offering a weekly course entitled "Catholicism 101: Introduction to Catholic Thought & Theology." The course is designed to introduce (or reintroduce) participants to the foundational principles, major content, doctrinal truths, and rich beauty of Catholic teaching. The goal of the course is to provide participants with an opportunity to enrich their understanding and love of the Catholic faith and to grapple with the timeless truths of Church teaching, even and especially when that truth bristles against modern culture. The course will occur weekly, between the 9am and 11am Sunday masses in Mercy Hall. We will gather in the cafeteria while Coffee & Donuts is going on. Upcoming Diocesan-Wide Survey

Soon, every adult in parishes across the diocese will be invited to complete an online (or paper) survey called "Disciple-Maker Index." This instrument was developed by the Catholic Leadership Institute as part of a Lilly Foundation grant-funded program to understand parish life from a leadership perspective. The Diocese of Lansing is one of a few dioceses invited to participate in this pilot program. This survey will provide helpful data to assess the current climate and health of the diocese (and parishes in the diocese). We will get data comparing our parish with others in the diocese, and with national averages. The survey includes Mass attendance, spiritual disciplines, and beliefs. Responses to the survey questions will be confidential, in order to get as accurate a picture as possible. The survey takes 10 to 15 minutes to complete, and the results will be invaluable to me, the staff, and our many volunteers as we seek ways to best support everyone in their discipleship journey. I look forward to sharing the findings with you when the project is complete. Thanks in advance for your help with this.


