A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Exodus 90 and Valentine's Day

Just a word of counsel to those men who are part of Exodus 90. As the national day of celebrating romantic relationships draws near, I want to encourage you to be prudent as you think about the disciplines of Exodus 90 and how you will spend time with your wife (or girlfriend) on the 14th or some other day of your choice. One perhaps unanticipated challenge of Exodus 90, especially for those who are married, is that the disciplines that you have chosen to take upon yourself often have ramifications for typical household life. That is, in some respects, as it should be. However, there are inevitable losses that wives feel when the way(s) that you are accustomed to spending time together get changed to accommodate Exodus 90 disciplines. NB: Asking your wives about this may not actually get you to the full truth about the challenges and loss they feel. Wives are (rightly!) very supportive of a husband's desire to become a better husband and father, and so they might be reluctant to be honest about how hard it is for them. With Valentine's Day in mind, I want to remind you all that one of the fruits of Exodus 90 is developing a stronger bond and loving relationship between husbands and wives. My free recommendation is that you men (not just Exodus 90 men!) ask your wives how they desire to celebrate your marriage next weekend, and, if at all possible, embrace their suggestions without regard to the disciplines of Exodus 90. That's not "cheating." That's playing wisely for the win!

(If you're planning to attend the men's conference in Ann Arbor, let me encourage you to enjoy that for most of the day and then leave in time to be able to enjoy an evening with your daughter(s).

Christians in the World

In light of this week's Gospel, I want to remind us all of a great Second Century text, the powerful "Letter to Diognetus." The letter makes clear the vital role Christians had then, and should have now, to be salt, light, and leaven in our world.

Christians are indistinguishable from other men either by nationality, language or customs. They do not inhabit separate cities of their own, or speak a strange dialect, or follow some outlandish way of life. Their teaching is not based upon reveries inspired by the curiosity of men. Unlike some other people, they champion no purely human doctrine. With regard to dress, food and manner of life in general, they follow the customs of whatever city they happen to be living in, whether it is Greek or foreign. And yet there is something extraordinary about their lives. They live in their own countries as though they were only passing through. They play their full role as citizens, but labor under all the disabilities of aliens. Any country can be their homeland, but for them their homeland, wherever it may be, is a foreign country. Like others, they marry and have children, but they do not expose them. They share their meals, but not their wives.

They live in the flesh, but they are not governed by the desires of the flesh. They pass their days upon earth, but they are citizens of heaven. Obedient to the laws, they yet live on a level that transcends the law. Christians love all men, but all men persecute them. Condemned because they are not understood, they are put to death, but raised to life again. They live in poverty, but enrich many; they are totally destitute, but possess an abundance of everything. They suffer dishonor, but that is their glory. They are defamed, but vindicated. A blessing is their answer to abuse, deference their response to insult. For the good they do they receive the punishment of malefactors, but even then they, rejoice, as though receiving the gift of life. They are attacked by the Jews as aliens, they are persecuted by the Greeks, vet no one can explain the reason for this hatred

To speak in general terms, we may say that the Christian is to the world what the soul is to the body. As the soul is present in every part of the body, while remaining distinct from it, so Christians are found in all the cities of the world, but cannot be identified with the world. As the visible body contains the invisible soul, so Christians are seen living in the world, but their religious life remains unseen. The body hates the soul and wars against it, not because of any injury the soul has done it, but because of the restriction the soul places on its pleasures. Similarly, the world hates the Christians, not because they have done it any wrong, but because they are opposed to its enjoyments.

Christians love those who hate them just as the soul loves the body and all its members despite the body's hatred. It is by the soul, enclosed within the body, that the body is held together, and similarly, it is by the Christians, detained in the world as in a prison, that the world is held together. The soul, though immortal, has a mortal dwelling place; and Christians also live for a time amidst perishable things, while awaiting the freedom from change and decay that will be theirs in heaven. As the soul benefits from the deprivation of food and drink, so Christians flourish under persecution. Such is the Christian's lofty and divinely appointed function, from which he is not permitted to excuse himself.




