### Election is ... still being tallied ...

... at least while I'm writing this bulletin article, on Wednesday afternoon. Perhaps initial counts will have been wrapped up by the time you read this. Perhaps not. In any case, I'm quite certain that there will be some legal challenges in this or that state or county. What that reveals, yet again this year, is that we are remarkably divided as a nation. However this comes out (and whenever that is determined) we are invited as Christians to model for our community and nation Christian charity. Even if we see this or that party as our "political enemy," as Christians, we are commanded to love our enemies, and to do good to those who persecute us. That's the Gospel, and we do well to look to the Lord for His grace and wisdom as we respond to Election 2020. Come, Holy Spirit!

### "In His Will Is Our Peace"

That phrase, which is an occasional antiphon in the Liturgy of the Hours, comes from Dante's Divine Comedy, and is a fitting reminder to us right now that whatever the result is now (and will be at the end of any legal wrangling) is within God's permissive, sovereign will. That is to say that it has not happened without God's foreknowledge and outside of His loving will for us. God allows all manner of trials and difficulties to come our way, including even tremendous unrest and division, to accomplish a greater good. Let us look for His presence in our current trials, and also see that these events—each and every one of them—is allowed by God to help perfect us, to help us become saints. That's what the world needs: Saints.

## **Helpful Reminder I**

Earlier this fall, I quoted this text from St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians, which seems as apt now as it did then: We urge vou, brothers, admonish the idle, cheer the fainthearted, support the weak, be patient with all. See that no one returns evil for evil; rather, always seek what is good [both] for each other and for all. Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophetic utterances. Test everything; retain what is good. *Refrain from every kind of evil. May the God of peace* himself make you perfectly holy and may you entirely, spirit, soul, and body, be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls vou is faithful, and he will also accomplish it. Brothers, pray for us [too]. (I Thes. 5:14-25)

## Helpful Reminder II

Here again is the wonderfully encouraging text from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians: Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. *Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer* and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with *vou. (Phil. 4:4-9)* 

### **Eucharistic Procession November 15**

As I talked about a month ago or so, a Eucharistic Procession has been scheduled for Sunday afternoon, November 15 at 2:00 p.m. This event was originally planned for October 17<sup>th</sup>, but we decided that after the election it would be even more important, as the nation continues to grapple with the divisions that exist. May our Eucharistic faith be a witness of faith, hope, and love in our sorely divided world.

The plan is to have those who are able to process on foot meet at our parish and to follow behind the ministers who will be carrying the Blessed Sacrament. Those who choose to join by vehicle in procession are asked to meet at Lansing Catholic High School at 1:30 p.m. The procession will begin at 2:00 p.m. We will process from Resurrection and travel down two lanes of Michigan Avenue to the Capitol and then on to St. Mary Cathedral for Benediction. Shuttle service will be available for those who need a ride back to Resurrection after the conclusion of the procession and Benediction. May those who see us be intrigued and encouraged by our witness, and come to know God's healing love!

In order to comply with State and Local health department rules, the Eucharistic Procession will be followed by a MOTORCADE of the faithful. Please carpool if you can and arrive at Lansing Catholic High School parking lot as close to 1:00 as possible.

The motorcade will leave LCHS at 1:50 for The Church of the Resurrection. At 2:00 the Eucharistic Procession will leave Resurrection, with the motorcade following the procession to the state Capitol.

Drivers will be directed to designated parking locations. It will be a two block walk to the Capitol from the parking sites. Parking in front of the Capitol will be reserved for handicappers. We will gather on the Capitol lawn for Adoration and addresses by clergy and laity, followed by Benediction on the Capitol steps.

The event will end with inspirational speaker Paco Gavrilides.

# Praying Through Advent: Hope - A Contemplative Retreat for Women


#### November 20-22, 2020
