#### God Is (Still) At Work

I'm writing this on Wednesday morning. The Gospel Acclamation for Wednesday of the 32<sup>nd</sup> Week of Ordinary Time was—surprise, surprise!—I Thessalonians 5:18, which I wrote about last Sunday. It seems as fitting today as it was last week. Indeed, it's fitting every day of every month of every year of our lives. Indeed, that text seems apt for every single moment of our lives. St. Paul tells us, In all circumstances, give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus. We are still in a period of uncertainty as a nation, at least in terms of the response of the various voting blocks who are so bitterly divided, and not a few people are stirring up fears. The Lord is near! Have no anxiety . . . The texts I included in last week's bulletin continue to reverberate in my heart. I hope you're able to find some consolation and hope right now.

#### **News/Internet Fast**

As I mentioned last weekend, I discerned that the Lord was asking me to get rid of the internet at my home, so that I can once again have that a place of prayerfulness, reading, and renewal, rather than (as it all too often had become!) a context within which I would track all-too-closely the Twitter feed and news and Catholic Commentariate. I had the internet installed so I could work from home during Covidtide, but since unplugging it all this weekend, my week has gone remarkably well. I'm not entirely disconnected, but my home life is more prayerful. I'm reading more, and I even picked up the banjo again, still very much a beginner on that. But my heart has been more at peace. I invite you to pray about what the Lord might be inviting you to do. Of course, we need to pray, but I think some of us spend more time than is prudent monitoring developments. Praying and entrusting developments to the Lord seems most effective and best for our joy and peace.

#### Unite Our Nation Lansing Eucharistic Procession

As I talked about a month ago or so, a Eucharistic Procession has been scheduled for today (Sunday) at 2:00 p.m. This event was originally planned for October 17<sup>th</sup>, but we decided that after the election it would be even more important, as the nation continues to grapple with the divisions that exist. May our Eucharistic faith be a witness of faith, hope, and love in our sorely divided world. IMPORTANT NOTE: In order to comply with State and Local

health department rules, the Eucharistic Procession will be followed by a MOTORCADE of the faithful. Volunteers and disabled individuals may park at Resurrection parish parking lot. All others should arrive between 1:00 - 1:30 pm at the Lansing Catholic High School parking lot on Marshall St. Further instructions will be provided to drivers at the motorcade line up. You are invited to bring a Rosary and cell phone for notifications. May those who see us be intrigued and encouraged by our witness, and come to know God's healing love!

#### **Using Our Talents**


