### Jesus Christ is King!

We come to the end of our Liturgical Year by celebrating the Reign of God manifest in Jesus Christ our Lord and King. Our entire life as Christians is ordered to hope and anticipation of Christ's return and our own fellowship with Him in Heaven. Our home is in Heaven, and the King who is to come is our Brother, our Friend. If we walk always by His side, following Him, accompanying Him in our daily choices, we have no reason to fear His return. He will welcome us into His Father's House.

### **Advent Begins Next Sunday**

What a great transition we find at this time of year! Right after we celebrate Christ's Kingship, we begin to anticipate His coming in three ways: His Incarnation (coming as a baby for us), His coming again in glory, and His coming in our hearts. It is a holy season of anticipation. To assist you in your preparation, please take a booklet filled with meditations for each day of Advent. May we all enter deeply into this great season of hope. Feel free to take a copy of the *Magnificat Advent Companion, at the various exits*.

### **Actions of MDHHS**

On Sunday, Governor Whitmer's administration issued a new order concerning public gatherings and various requirements limiting gathering. This is from the advisory to parishes and schools from the diocese: As you are likely aware, [last Sunday] evening, Governor Whitmer announced a new COVID-19 Order issued through the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services under the authority of the Michigan Public Health Code to control the spread of an epidemic, which includes the power to ban gatherings of people. The orders go into effect at 12:01 a.m. on Wednesday, November 18....

### **Gatherings**

Unlike past orders, which had allowed for various indoor gatherings subject to capacity limits, the new orders completely ban all non-residential indoor gatherings. Residential gatherings are limited to 10 persons, and no more than 2 households. Restaurants and bars are also now closed for indoor gatherings. In light of these new restrictions, parish halls should be closed and all parish gatherings prohibited. (Outdoor gatherings of up to 25 people are permitted provided there is adequate space to social distance.)

### Important note regarding Mass

As in the past, all orders remain subject to constitutional protections, such as the free exercise of religion. In recognition of this, the new MDHHS order again includes an exemption from penalty for religious

worship. Bishop Boyea has confirmed that Masses (and sacraments and devotions) will continue under the present liturgical guidelines. I also note that the Diocese remains unaware of any outbreaks connected to one of its churches.

### **Our Response**

I have to say that I am very grateful that we are able to continue to celebrate Mass and keep our school in session. However, to comply with this recent Order, we are canceling other gatherings, such as the Wednesday morning Men's Prayer Breakfast and Coffee & Donuts. All other meetings will be moved to virtual for now. Our office will return to the "remote" access only that we had early on in the pandemic. Only a few of us who have need to work in our office will do so. The rest will "telecommute."

### The Good Shepherd and the Sheep and the Goats

This weekend, Jesus tells the parable of the Sheep and the Goats, which gives us a window into our judgment at the end of time. The first reading this week is from the Prophet Ezekiel. It's a beautiful reminder of the Good Shepherd's commitment to care for us, to heal us. Take some time to pray and meditate on this beautiful reading:

Thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord GOD. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal . . .

The reading concludes with strong words of judgment. As we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we do well to call to mind that one day we will all face the judgment. Let us let the Lord heal us so that we are ready for Him when He returns.
