Joyful Mysteries

The first mysteries in the Rosary are aptly called "joyful." In the Gospel this week, we recall with joy and wonder the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Angel Gabriel speaks the beautiful prophetic word to her, informing her that she will bear a son, whom she will name Jesus. "He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." What grace it is to think that a young maiden would humbly say "yes" to a life of doing the Father's Will. In that "yes," Mary gave birth to the Savior in her heart. Nine months later, she and Joseph, along with the awestruck witnesses, would witness the Glory of the Lord, lying weak and vulnerable in the manger. We thank God for the grace, joy, and peace Jesus brought to them. He comes again this Christmas to give joy and peace to each of us as well. He is the reason for Eucharist, for thanksgiving.

As we anticipate the celebration of Christ's birth, I want to thank all of you for your prayerful support of me as your pastor. Thanks too for the material support you have given to the ministry of the Church of the Resurrection. Because of your gifts of time, talent, and treasure, we are able to spread the Good News in our parish, school, and community. As I reflect on God's gifts to me this Christmas, I am unspeakably grateful for you and for your gracious response to the Lord. Simply put, it has been a joy for me to serve as your pastor. Indeed, I have felt a great sense of openness to the Spirit here and look forward with anticipation to what the Lord has in store for us in 2021. Let us be open to God's leading, and grow together in our knowledge, love, and practice of our faith.

Christmas & New Year's Mass Schedule

This coming week, we celebrate one of our Church's greatest Feasts. And, even if your friends and family don't typically come to Mass, they will probably feel the urge to go to church. Please invite them to join you as we gather together to rejoice in Our Newborn King. On Christmas Eve, we will have Masses at 4:30, 6:30, and Midnight (prelude music will commence at 11:30 p.m.). On Christmas Day, we will have two Masses, one at 9:30 and the other at 11:30 a.m. Then, on the Eighth Day (the Octave) of Christmas, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. We will have three Vigil Masses, one at 4:30 p.m., one at 6:30 p.m. and one at 10:30 p.m., followed by adoration with Benediction just prior to midnight. On New Year's Day, we will have one Mass at 9:30 a.m. Please note that our offices will be closed on December 24 and all day Christmas. The

office will be closed on December 31st and January 1st. End of year donations can be placed in the mail slot on the east door of the driveway of the office, and will be credited for 2020 if given by the end of the day on December 31st.

Important Note about Seating at Masses

In this year of Covid, I did not want to require people to sign-up for Masses, so I am asking and praying that people will prayerfully consider coming to another Mass, rather than the 4:30 p.m. Mass. If you and your family typically come to the 4:30 p.m. Mass, please consider the 6:30 p.m. Mass this year. We want to honor, as much as possible, the expectations for social distancing, but we realize that will be difficult. I expect the 4:30 to still be very crowded, so please avoid it if you or others in your household are "at risk." Please NOTE: We cannot allow groups to come early and block out pews for their families, because it would be unjust for those who arrive looking for seating. I know that will be frustrating for some people who are used to having their official "place-holders" come early to save seats, but we cannot and will not allow that this year. First-come, first-seated is the only way to be just in terms of who is able to attend (especially) the 4:30 Mass. As a reminder, you will have a greater likelihood of sitting together at a different Mass. In fact, the lightest attended Mass is most likely to be the 9:30 Christmas morning Mass, so that would likely be the best Mass to attend if you are "at risk." The 10:30 p.m. Mass on New Year's Eve is likely to be the least well-attended for the Solemnity of the Mother of God.

Merry Christmas!

Thanks to generous donations from parishioners, please take a copy of the various books that we have as Christmas gifts this year. You will find them at the various exits. We ask that you limit yourself to one copy per household of Live Not by Lies: A Manual for Christian Dissidents, by Rod Dreher, and A Church in Crisis: Pathways Forward, by Ralph Martin. I also recommended reading through the US Conference of Catholic Bishops' pastoral letter on racism: Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love. That letter can be downloaded from the USCCB website. We will also have a couple other titles that we hope will be edifying to you this year. May you and your family have a blessed last week of Advent and a joyous celebration of Christmas, in this most difficult of year. God bless you all!

2020 Year End Giving Tax Deadlines

For your contributions to appear in your 2020 parish donor statement they need to be received at the parish office via mail on December 31st or dropped off in the office drop box by 1:00pm (east wall door) or be placed into the wall collection boxes in the church on December 31st by the end of the New Year's eve mass. Donations received after the aforementioned deadlines will go on 2021 donor statements with the following exception: those received via mail posted with a December date and received in the office by January 8th, these will be included in 2020 donor records. Note that the postal service usually, but not always, post marks envelopes. Please plan accordingly. Thank you for your prayerful consideration of supporting the parish's mission here in the heart of Lansing especially during this unusual Covid year.

The fruit that I have seen come from Catholic Youth Summer Camp, in the spiritual and social development of their campers, I believe, makes it more than worthy of consideration in your summer plans. 
