Forty Days of Lent

This Wednesday, we begin again the Holy Season of Lent to prepare our hearts for the profundity of Holy Week. As we prepare for forty days of Lent, let us all fast, pray, and give alms for our own conversion, our parish, and our community. This is a moment of grace and opportunity, for us to be witnesses of the truth and the power of conversion. May we all pray and fast for others, that all men and women would yield their will to the will of the One who is truly Lord of Heaven and Earth.

Fasting for Him

As a reminder, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast and Abstinence. In the Church, the minimum required fast, which applies to those between the ages of 18 and 59, is to refrain from eating between meals and to limit their eating to one full meal and two lighter meals that do not add up to a full meal. The law of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) applies to those 14 years of age and older. *All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence*. Let me encourage you to see these days of fasting and abstinence as an invitation to deepen your hunger for God and to discipline the appetites of the flesh

Ash Wednesday and Beyond

There will be three Masses on Ash Wednesday at which we will distribute ashes. Come pray with us, as we begin our Lenten Journey together. The Masses will be held at 8:15 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 6:30 p.m. See the bulletin for other opportunities to pray more this Lent. Each Friday, we will pray the Stations of the Cross in the church at 6:30 p.m. Our plan will be to distribute ashes as usual. There are some parishes that are sprinkling ashes instead of imposing them with the exhortation. You'll have to call around to find a parish that will be giving that as an option.

40 Days for Life (Begins Ash Wednesday)

Beginning Ash Wednesday (2/17), another 40 Days for Life campaign will begin. This year the site of prayers will be the Planned Parenthood facility in Frandor. I am grateful for the strong commitment to pray and serve among our parishioners, and invite all of us to keep this in our prayers throughout Lent. This nationwide effort has born tremendous fruit, and I am hopeful that we will see the closing of this facility very soon. Please join us for the 40 Days for Life Kick-off meeting in our own Mercy Hall Sunday afternoon, February 14th at 2:00 p.m.

Black History Month and Venerable Augustus Tolton

This past Wednesday, I presented two icons of Venerable Augustus Tolton, the first African American priest in the United States, whose cause for Canonization has proceeded to the point of him having been declared "Venerable" by Pope Francis in June 2019. In my homily, which you can find on our YouTube channel, I talked about his family's (and his own) struggle against racism in our nation and in the Catholic Church. He was born a slave, and was denied access to

any seminaries in the United States because he was "colored." Thank the Lord, he was able of complete his seminary studies in Rome, where the Church is, indeed, universal, and ended up coming back to the United States to serve as a priest. You can learn more about his life at the website dedicated to his canonization at the Archdiocese of Chicago website. We have a link to that website and a picture of the icon on our website. May we all pray for racial healing in our nation and in the Catholic Church in America.



THE GOSPEL OF LIFE @ 25:

Just over a quarter of a century ago, Pope Saint John Paul II released his prophetic encyclical, Evangelium vitae, in response to the ever-increasing attacks against human life and dignity.

Over the next 12 months, we will be releasing a weekly teaching or reflection on this important encyclical so that the faithful may grow in their understanding of the Church's teaching on matters of life and human dignity. We hope you will join us on this journey of life.

Evangelium vitae, translated in English to "The Gospel of Life", was promulgated in Rome on 25 March 1995 by Pope John Paul II. It deals with issues pertaining to the sanctity of human life, including murder, abortion, euthanasia, and capital punishment, reaffirming the Church's timeless teachings on those issues in a way that is relevant to this day.

The document gave greater foundation and focus to what a "Culture of Life" should look like and, by contrast, greater understanding as to what underpins the contemporary "Culture of Death" which continues to hold sway over much of the western world.

The United States' Conference of Catholic Bishops had designated 2020 as the year to begin celebrating the 25th anniversary of Evangelium vitae but, as with many things, COVID-19 got in the way. Hence the beginning of this new series, introduced upon this Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, January 22, 2021. Next installment? Next week. Until then, God bless you.
